Chairperson Bartley called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

Be it noted, the expenditure adjustments for the month of February 2020 were presented to the board. \$2,937.20 was transferred to allocate highway department expenditures to other county departments for work performed and supplies furnished by the highway department.

Be it noted, the Register of Deeds Statement of Fees collected for the month of February 2020 in the amount of \$20,216.50 was presented to the board.

Be it noted, the Investment Policy, Money Market Accounts, CD's with Maturity Date and Interest Rate, and Checking Account Balances were presented to the board.

County Development Director Robert Hill said they've reviewed the pandemic plan. Hill said the Emergency Operations Center is setup at the East Fire Station.

Bartley said the City of Brookings is putting in 5 IP phones at the Emergency Operations Center and asked if that is something the county needs if they had to work remotely. Hill said the system that's in place right now does works well. Bartley asked Pierce to explain how the IP phones work. Pierce said it's a phone that is hooked up to the computer, which is hooked up to the telephone system. She said they can do everything at home that they would do in an office.

Bartley asked the board if that is something they want to look into. Bartley said reimbursement for the phones could be a possibility through federal emergency grant dollars.

By consensus, the board agreed to move forward with looking into securing IP phones.

Sheriff Martin Stanwick said there are 31 inmates in jail. Stanwick thanked Maintenance Technician Terry Heidemann for working so hard to keep the detention center clean.

Stanwick said they've started security at the courthouse.

Pierce asked Stanwick how his department handles incoming inmates. Stanwick said their temperature is taken and they isolate them before going into general population.

A RESOLUTION CHANGING THE LOCATION OF THE VOTE CENTER SITE IN SINAI, SD

WHEREAS, the Sinai Fire Hall meets the handicapped accessibility requirements of the Help America Vote Act and Americans with Disability Act.

Commission Department Director Stacy Steffensen gave a PowerPoint presentation recapping FY2019. The board thanked Steffensen for putting the report together. Bartley asked if the report could be added to the county’s website for better transparency. Pierce suggested adding a footnote that says what bridges were completed in 2019.

Finance Officer Vicki Busetth and Finance Analyst Jennifer Beller presented the FY2019 Annual Report.

Commission Department Director Stacy Steffensen presented the Commission Department Director’s Report. Steffensen said the February month-end General Fund surplus analysis is below the 10-year average, but that’s because bills are being paid and the county has not received first-half property taxes.

Steffensen presented a draft letter to send to townships for this year’s round of culvert grant funding.

Steffensen said they are working with a new system that would allow the board to meet telephonically during this pandemic. IT Specialist Shawn Plowman said Swiftel Communication set them up yesterday. He said it allows 20 people to be on the system at one time. Bartley asked if

the board wants to implement this for the next meeting. Krogman asked how this would work for the public. Plowman said they would call in and use a code the same way the board does.

By consensus, the board agreed to run the meetings telephonically with Chairperson Bartley attending the meeting in person.

States Attorney Dan Nelson said they continue to do criminal court and are scheduling cases on an as-needed basis. Nelson discussed an ordinance regarding the pandemic that the City of Brookings is adopting. Nelson said the Commission could take action on a resolution instead of an emergency ordinance. The Commission asked what businesses in the county would be affected

Finance Officer Vicki Buseth said Brookings County currently holds six liquor licenses and nine malt beverage licenses. Bartley said the first line of defense is staying home, social distancing and holding meetings telephonically. Bartley said a resolution encourages businesses to close down to the public, which most businesses have done already.

Bartley suggested a resolution be drafted for the board to take action on at the next regular scheduled meeting. Steffensen said the board is holding a Special Commission Meeting tomorrow, Wednesday 25th. She said the board could take action on the resolution during that meeting. Bartley asked what the deadline would be. Commissioner Boersma suggested a 30 day deadline and then they could re-evaluate it.

Commissioner Boersma attended the Brookings Behavioral Health & Wellness Meeting via Zoom.

Commissioner Krogman had nothing to report.

Commissioner Jensen attended the 20th Street Overpass Meeting; conducted interviews for the BCOAC Director's position; and attended a Weed & Pest Meeting.

Commissioner Bartley attended a PPCC/POD Meeting.

Motion by Pierce, seconded by Boersma to amend the Resolution so that it reads: Now Therefore, Be it Resolved that the Brookings County Commission hereby encourages the following. Voice vote on amendment: All members voted “aye.” Amendment carried.

Voice vote on main motion as amended: All members voted “aye.” Main motion as amended carried.

BROOKING COUNTY RESOLUTION #20-12

AN EMERGENCY RESOLUTION TO ADDRESS A PUBLIC HEALTH CRISIS BY ENCOURAGING CERTAIN MEASURES THAT HAVE BEEN DEEMED NECESSARY TO SLOW THE COMMUNITY SPREAD OF CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)

WHEREAS, an outbreak of the disease COVID-19, which is caused by the novel coronavirus, has been confirmed in more than 100 countries, including the United States; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 is a severe respiratory disease transmitted by person-to-person contact, or by contact with surfaces contaminated by the virus. In some cases, especially among older adults and persons with serious underlying health conditions, COVID-19 can result in serious illness requiring hospitalization, admission to an intensive care unit, and death; and

WHEREAS, the World Health Organization (WHO), the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services have declared the outbreak of COVID-19 as a public health emergency; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States declared a national emergency in response to the global pandemic of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on the same day, Governor Kristi Noem, issued Executive Order 2020-04 which declared a state of emergency to exist in the State of South Dakota in response to the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, cases of COVID-19 have been confirmed in Brookings County, South Dakota; and

WHEREAS, the CDC and health experts have recommended social distancing to slow the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, social distancing is a method of slowing down or stopping the spread of a contagious disease by reducing the probability of contact between infected persons and those not infected in order to minimize disease transmission; and

WHEREAS, in response to the need to implement social distancing all schools in the state have been closed for an extended period; and

WHEREAS, on March 16th, the White House issued guidance recommending that social gatherings of more than ten people be avoided and that people avoid eating or drinking at bars, restaurants, and food courts; and

WHEREAS, the guidance issued by the White House further recommended that in states with evidence of community transmission, bars, restaurants, food courts, gyms, and other indoor and outdoor venues where people congregate should be closed; and

WHEREAS, many states and communities across the country have already implemented the White House recommendations by ordering all bars, restaurants, food courts, gyms, and other indoor and outdoor venues where people congregate be closed until the public health emergency is over; and

WHEREAS, the failure to successfully implement social distancing will likely result in higher numbers of infected individuals and has the potential to overwhelm the capacity of the County's health care providers; and

WHEREAS, it is important that control measures be taken to reduce or slow down the spread of COVID-19 in order to protect the health and safety of the County's residents, especially for seniors and those with underlying health conditions that make them particularly vulnerable to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 23, 2020 Governor Kristi Noem, issued an Executive Order that sets forth guidelines for every South Dakota resident, business, healthcare provider, and local and municipal government to stop the spread of COVID-19;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Brookings County Commission hereby encourages the following:

1. Employers, both for profit and not-for-profit, within Brookings County should:
 - a. Implement the recommended CDC hygiene practices and other business strategies designed to reduce the likelihood of spreading the disease.
 - b. Understand that the COVID-19 is not a short-term challenge, and operations will need to endure a difficult and limited social environment for potentially eight weeks or more.

- c. Innovate and continue to demonstrate entrepreneurial excellence in their operations during this difficult and uncertain environment.
 - d. Encourage staff to telework if possible, implement social distancing measures, limit unnecessary work gatherings, limit non-essential travel, and consider regular health checks including CDC guidance for COVID-19 screening if possible.
 - e. Offer, to the extent possible, special shopping times or access periods for populations particularly vulnerable to COVID-19.
2. Any bar, restaurant, brewery, cafe, casino, coffee shop, recreational or athletic facility, health club, or entertainment venue within Brookings County should:
- a. Suspend or modify business practices as recommended by CDC guidance that involve ten or more people to be in an enclosed space where physical separation of at least six feet is not possible.
 - b. Continue offering or consider offering business models that do not involve public gatherings, including takeout, delivery, drive-through, curbside service, off-site services, social distancing models, or other innovative business practices that do not involve public gatherings in an enclosed space.
 - c. Consider business arrangements and innovative ideas intended to support the critical infrastructure sectors, as defined by the Department of Homeland Security.

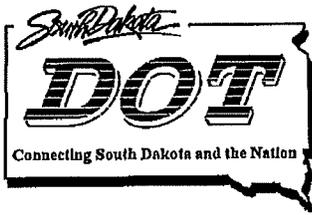

Dear Superintendent:

Attached to this memorandum is the consultant selection resolution and a computer printout of the bridges in your County that are due to be inspected during the calendar year 2020. Please review it carefully and make any comments regarding a change in status of any structure that may have been or is scheduled to be **CLOSED, REMOVED, REPLACED WITH A NEW STRUCTURE, OR REPLACED WITH A PIPE** since the last inspection. These comments may be shown on the computer printout. Your careful attention to this list will help reduce unnecessary inspection expenses.

The U.S. Federal Highway Administration requires the initial inspection of all bridges and the reinspection at intervals not to exceed two years (Title 23, Section 151, *United States Code* and Title 23, Part 650, Subpart C, *Code of Federal Regulations*) with the exception of reinforced concrete box culverts (RCBC) that meet specific criteria. These culverts are reinspected at intervals not to exceed four years. Any government jurisdiction failing to comply with the posting and reinspection requirements of the National Bridge Inspection Standards (NBIS) Program may lose its eligibility for Federal transportation dollars.

Most South Dakota Counties have done a commendable job in initiating and following through on bridge inspections and postings.

The NBIS Program requires all structures over 20 feet in length be inspected every two years (or four years for specific RCBC's) by a qualified inspector. To accomplish the inspections in your County during 2020, the following three approaches are open to you:

1. Hire a consulting engineer to inspect the bridges due for inspection and pay for these services utilizing 100% County funds;
2. Follow the prescribed South Dakota Department of Transportation (SDDOT) procedures for Consultant Selection of Engineering Services, hire the consultant of your choice and qualify for 80% Federal reimbursement participation in the cost of the inspections; or

3. Utilize one of the twenty-one (21) consulting firms listed on Attachment A that are under retainer contract with the SDDOT and pay 20% of the costs with County funds. The procedures to implement this step are detailed below.

Federal Bridge Replacement Funds can be utilized to hire qualified engineering firms to perform these inspections. However, Federal regulations define specific steps, including requests for proposals, evaluation committees, competitive negotiations, etc., which must be followed when using Federal funds. In an effort to assist Counties in securing Federal funds for bridge inspections, SDDOT has undertaken competitive negotiations with several consulting engineering firms. Twenty-one firms have been qualified to sign retainer agreements with SDDOT. Services performed under these retainer agreements are eligible for Federal participation.

If the County would like to utilize one of these firms under SDDOT retainer contracts, then the County should take the following steps:

1. The County should indicate the firm it wishes to employ in a resolution to SDDOT (copy attached) pledging to provide the local match required to obtain Federal Bridge Replacement funds.
2. SDDOT will initiate an agreement work order with the consulting engineering firm that you have selected for their execution. The consultant then forwards the original, fully executed, work order to you for your signature. You will forward the original, signed, work order to this office for signature. One copy will be returned to you, one copy is returned to the consultant, and the original is kept on file at SDDOT.

The work order indicates the location and types of structures to be inspected in your County. It also shows estimated travel, per diem, and other costs related to the inspection. The summation of all these costs will be the basis for the maximum limiting amount of the work order.

3. If the County does not concur with the work order, it can request SDDOT to contract with another firm under retainer.
4. SDDOT will then issue a *Notice to Proceed* to the consulting engineering firm with a copy sent to the County. SDDOT will bill the County for its local match as the consultant completes its unit work products.

Counties are under no obligation to use the twenty-one consulting engineering firms under SDDOT retainer agreements. Counties can still obtain Federal funds by conducting SDDOT approved competitive negotiations with other engineering firms or by using 100% County funds to pay for engineering services. SDDOT is offering these firms under retainer agreement to the Counties as a relatively quick way to get bridge inspections underway and still meet Federal requirements for competitive negotiations.

Please note that once again this year the consultants will be required to keep a ledger of their time and expenses for their inspection services. They will be reimbursed at a cost plus fixed fee rate for these services, similar to their reimbursement for design services. The flat rate per structure by structure type is no longer being used.

**BRIDGE REINSPECTION
PROGRAM RESOLUTION
FOR USE WITH SDDOT RETAINER CONTRACTS**

WHEREAS, Title 23, Section 151, *United States Code* and Title 23, Part 650, Subpart C, *Code of Federal Regulations*, requires initial inspection of all bridges and reinspection at intervals not to exceed two years with the exception of reinforced concrete box culverts that meet specific criteria. These culverts are reinspected at intervals not to exceed four years.

THEREFORE, Brookings County is desirous of participating in the Bridge Inspection Program using Bridge Replacement funds.

The County requests SDDOT to hire Banner Associates Inc. (Consulting Engineers) for the inspection work. SDDOT will secure federal approvals, make payments to the Consulting Engineer for inspection services rendered, and bill the County for 20% of the cost. The County will be responsible for the required 20% matching funds.

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements of Brookings County (County) as of December 31, 2018 and for the year then ended, in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in Government Auditing Standards issued by the Comptroller General of the United States, we considered County's internal control over financial reporting (internal control) as a basis for designing our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinions on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the County's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the County's internal control.

A *deficiency in internal control* exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct misstatements on a timely basis. We are providing this letter in connection with your audit of the financial statements of Brookings County as of December 31, 2018 and for the year then ended for the purpose of expressing an opinion as to whether the basic financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the governmental activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of Brookings County and the respective changes in financial position in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. We confirm that we are responsible for the fair presentation of the aforementioned financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. We are also responsible for adopting sound accounting policies, establishing and maintaining appropriate internal controls, and preventing and detecting fraud.

Certain representations in this letter are described as being limited to matters that are material. Items are considered material, regardless of size, if they involve an omission or misstatement of accounting information that, in light of surrounding circumstances, makes it probable that the judgment of a reasonable person relying on the information would be changed or influenced by the omission or misstatement. 13. There have been no communications from regulatory agencies concerning noncompliance with, or deficiencies in, financial reporting practices that could have a material effect on the financial statements.
14. There are no material transactions that have not been properly recorded in the accounting records underlying our financial statements or the schedule of expenditures of federal awards.
15. We have reviewed your potential audit adjustments and concur that the effects of the uncorrected misstatements aggregated by you during your audit are immaterial, both

individually and in the aggregate, to the financial statements of each reporting unit taken as a whole.

16. We acknowledge our responsibility for the design and implementation of programs and controls to both prevent and detect fraud.

Regular Business Items

- ❖ Bridge Resolution: This was submitted by the Highway Department and Brian Gustad is recommending Banner Associates.
- ❖ Transfer: This is the action to transfer the Commission Traverse to the Sheriff's Department for their use as a transport vehicle. The new Commission Durango arrived a couple of weeks ago.
- ❖ Audit Report: The FY2018 audit report from Auditor Joshua Shellum is included in the packet. He will not be present at the meeting, however he has spoken with Commissioner Bartley.

Director's Report

- ✓ We need consensus from the board to advertise for a supplemental budget hearing. The City did not bill the County for the new parking lot until March 27, 2020. Because this was a budgeted item in FY2019, we will need to do a supplemental budget hearing to move those budgeted dollars that rolled into fund balance back into the FY2020 budget to reimburse the City. Our total for the project was \$91,894.64.
- ✓ The estimate to have generator hook-ups installed at the BCOAC is almost \$22,000. To move forward with using the facility as a Red Cross shelter, this would need to be installed. It could come out of the capital budget (301) which has \$50,000 in it for FY2020. The only pending expense that I am aware of is a possible change order request from Bowes for the parking lot, which is about \$7,300.

The Department of Environment and Natural Resources received four copies of the plans and specifications for the proposed calf barn at your operation on January 29, 2020. Your operation is currently permitted under the 2017 *General Water Pollution Control Permit for Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations* (general permit), **permit application number SDG-100065**. The North Unit manure management system is located in the Southeast $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 15, Township 112 North, Range 50 West and the South Unit manure management system is located in the Southwest $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 22, Township 112 North, Range 50 West in Brookings County, South Dakota.

North Unit

Your permitted North Unit manure management system is for a housed lot feeding a maximum of 1,300-head of dairy cattle consisting of 950-head of mature dairy cattle and 350 dairy calves. Your system consists of five freestall barns, a calf hut area, a milk parlor, a manure solids separator and concrete manure solids stacking pad, a commodity barn, two bunker silos, diversion dikes or channels, two holding ponds, piping, two lift stations, and 2.3 acres of drainage area. Each barn contains a concrete flush gutter for transferring the manure and wastewater from the barns to the manure solids separator. The holding pond system is designed for at least 270 days of liquid storage capacity.

South Unit

Your permitted South Unit manure management system is for a housed lot feeding a maximum of 3,000-head of mature dairy cattle. Your system consists of a flume system in two freestall barns and a milk parlor/holding area, piping, diversion dikes or channels, a feed storage area, two concrete manure pits, a solids separator, a clay-lined solids stacking pad, three holding ponds, and 0.78 acres of drainage area. The holding pond system is designed for at least 270 days of liquid storage capacity.

The proposed revisions at the North Unit dairy consist of the following:

- A proposed calf barn will be constructed along the east side of the existing north freestall barn. The north and south areas within the barn will be a straw bedded pack over a concrete floor. The solids will be stored on the existing solids stacking pad;
- A concrete reception pit will be constructed along the west side of the proposed calf barn. Wastewater from the scrape alleys in the middle of the barn will be collected in the reception pit and pumped to the existing north holding pond;
- An 8-inch PVC pipe will be installed between the proposed reception pit in the calf barn and the existing north holding pond with a concrete chute and splash pad constructed beneath the piping in the holding pond;
- The number of mature dairy cattle at the North Unit dairy will be decreased by 72 head and the number of calves will be increased by 250 head. The new maximum animal population at the North Unit dairy will be 878-head of mature dairy cattle and 600-head of calves; and
- With these changes, the holding pond system will still have at least 270 days of liquid storage capacity and the stacking pad will still have at least 365 days of solids storage capacity.

We have reviewed and hereby conditionally approve the revised plans and specifications for your project. This approval expires on March 19, 2022, unless construction of the proposed calf barn has been started by that date. Once construction has commenced, you will have three years to complete construction and submit a Notice of Completion. If construction is not completed within the three year timeframe this approval will expire. Two copies of the approved plans and specifications are being retained for our files and requirements you must implement are listed on the attached pages.

If there are any other modifications to your system, a complete set of as-built plans will be required if any major deviations result. If you plan to make any of the following modifications to your approved permit application prior to obtaining permit coverage for the proposed calf barn, you will need to start the permitting process over which will require a new public notice. These modifications include: a change to the location of a process wastewater containment structure where additional soil borings are needed; a change to the type of manure or process wastewater storage structure; an increase in the amount of manure or process wastewater generated; a decrease in the manure or process wastewater storage volume in the manure containment system; or a modification to the nutrient management plan that results in a change in crop rotation or an increase in the land application acres.

Upon completion of construction, the enclosed Notice of Completion must be returned to the department. **You cannot populate the proposed calf barn or use the proposed reception pit to store manure until an amended Certificate of Compliance and coverage under the 2017 state general permit are issued. Once the Notice of Completion has been received and a satisfactory construction inspection has been conducted, the department will issue an amended Certificate of Compliance and coverage under the 2017 state general permit for the calf barn.**

One copy of the submitted permit application is being retained for our files. If you plan to increase your maximum number of animals or make any modifications to your manure management system,

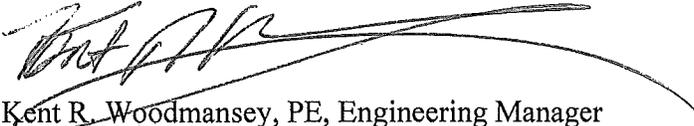
you must obtain department approval prior to increasing your animal numbers or beginning any new construction. If you plan to make any modifications to your nutrient management plan that include a change in manure application method, the addition of land application fields, or a change in crop rotation, you must obtain department approval prior to making the change.

Continued compliance is dependent upon you performing proper operation and maintenance activities. You will be liable for any noncompliance with applicable South Dakota environmental laws or regulations.

Approval of the plans and specifications does not in any way release the applicant from the responsibility that the project will be an operable facility when construction is completed.

REQUIREMENTS

The following requirements must be implemented before we will issue an amended Certificate of Compliance and coverage under the 2017 general permit. Failure to implement these requirements will invalidate this approval.

State General Permit

You will be required to operate your feeding operation and manure management system in accordance with the requirements in the general permit.

1. Notification

Construction Schedule - You or your engineer must notify the department of the proposed construction schedule for your project to allow our personnel the opportunity for construction inspections. Please fill out the enclosed postcard and return it to us prior to beginning construction of the proposed calf barn. If any of the dates change from the ones submitted on the postcard, please notify us at (605) 773-3351 and ask for Ben Myers.

Other Government - You are responsible for contacting your local planning and zoning office to determine if there are any local ordinances or requirements with which you need to comply. If a stream, lake, or wetland will be dredged or filled during the construction of the feeding operation, then you need to contact the United States Corps of Engineers at (605) 224-8531 prior to construction of the manure management system.

Notice of Completion - The Notice of Completion form must be completed by your engineer and returned to the department when construction of the calf barn is complete. The department cannot issue you a Certificate of Compliance and coverage under the 2017 state general permit until we receive a Notice of Completion. **You cannot populate the proposed calf barn or use the proposed reception pit to store manure until an amended Certificate of Compliance and coverage under the 2017 state general permit are issued. Once the Notice of Completion has been received and a satisfactory construction inspection has been conducted, the department will issue an amended Certificate of Compliance and coverage under the 2017 state general permit.**

2. Initial Nutrient Management Plan (NMP)

An updated NMP CPA-63 spreadsheet was submitted that includes the additional animals. No new fields were added and there are adequate acres available for manure application for the additional animals.

REQUIREMENTS CONTINUED

3. Setback Distance and Water Wells

The manure management system and the application sites must be located at least 100 feet from a private well owned by you if the top of the aquifer is 100 feet or more below the land surface, 150 feet from a private well owned by you if the top of the aquifer is less than 100 feet below the land surface, 250 feet from a private well not owned by you and 1,000 feet from any public supply well. These areas can not be included in the land application areas. You must provide information indicating whether any public water wells or water sources exist within 1,000 feet of the manure application sites.

4. Other Permits That will of May Be Required

Storm Water Permit - If construction will disturb more than one acre in total land area, **you must obtain a general storm water construction permit.** This permit must be obtained before you can start constructing your proposed manure management system. Information concerning this permit can be obtained by calling the Surface Water Quality Program at 1-800-737-8676. **A copy of this plan must be kept on-site during construction for review by DENR inspectors.**

Emergency Power Generator - The department has observed that emergency power generators have been installed at similar sized operations. If an emergency power generator will be installed at your operation it may require that you obtain an air quality permit. Please contact Earl Berg with the department's Air Quality Program at (605) 773-3151, to determine whether an air quality permit is required. If an air quality permit is required, you must have that permit prior to using the generator.

Permit to Occupy Right of Way - If manure application will involve placing hoses or other equipment in a state highway right of way (for example, in a road ditch or through a culvert), you must first obtain a Permit to Occupy Right of Way. Application for this permit may be made through the local South Dakota Department of Transportation area office. Contact your local SD DOT area office for more information on this permit. In addition, please contact your county highway superintendent to determine if your county has similar requirements.

We are approving the modification and are including *Fields 19, 68, 69, and 70* in your approved phosphorus-based NMP. **Please put one copy of the approved field information in Appendix D of your copy of the permit.** You are required to comply with the terms and conditions of your permit.


