Gustad updated the board on the structures south on Highway 77. Krogman asked when it will be completed. Gustad said the completion date is August 15th.

Finance Officer Vicki Buseth said their office did 1,028 title transfers for the month of May. Buseth said they continue to work on budgets.

Buseth said the Primary Election went well. Buseth thanked her staff, the poll workers, the three temporary workers who worked Absentee Voting and the IT staff for their hard work on running the election.

County Development Director Robert Hill attended an LEPC Meeting; attended an E-911 Meeting; and attended the City of Sinai City Council Meeting. Hill said they conducted a county siren test. He said all of the sirens in the small towns work.

Hill said he attended the County Planning & Zoning Meeting.

Hill said he attended a meeting with Banner Associates and several other people to discuss the drainage pattern south of the county road known as the Sinai road. Hill said he has them working on a quote for a Feasibility Study. He said it would benefit Medary Township and the county highway system. Hill said there will be more discussion in detail on that matter at the June 16th Commission Meeting.

Pierce asked Hill about the census. Hill said they are about 67% for responses.

BCOAC Director Dustin Huber said they are starting to pick up at the BCOAC. Huber updated the board on upcoming events. He said there will be a blood drive on June 29th.

AN ACT

ENTITLED An Act to clarify provisions regarding the discretionary formula for determining the assessed value of property for tax purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

Section 1. That § 10-6-35.2 be AMENDED:

10-6-35.2. Discretionary formula for reduced taxation of new structures and additions--Partially constructed structures.

Any structure classified pursuant to this section, shall, following construction, be valued for taxation purposes in the usual manner. However, the board of county commissioners of the county where the structure is located, may adopt any formula for assessed value to be used for tax purposes. The formula may include for any or all of the five tax years following construction all, any portion or none of the assessed valuation for tax purposes. Any formula adopted shall be equally applied to specifically classified structures within a tax increment finance district. The board of county commissioners of the county where the structure is located may, if requested by the owner of the structure, not apply the discretionary formula and the full assessment shall be made without application of the formula. In waiving the formula for the structure of one owner, the board of county commissioners is not prohibited from applying the formula for subsequent new structures. The assessed valuation during any of the five years may not be less than the assessed valuation of the property in the year preceding the first year of the tax years following construction.

Any structure that is partially constructed on the assessment date may be valued for tax purposes pursuant to this section and the valuation may not be less than the assessed valuation of the property in the year preceding the beginning of construction. The period that the property is valued for tax purposes under this section may include the years when the property is partially constructed.

Following the five-year period under this section, the property shall be assessed at the same percentage as is all other property for tax purposes.

Any of the following types of real property may be specifically classified for the purpose of taxation pursuant to this section:

- (1) Any new industrial or commercial structure, or any addition, renovation, or reconstruction to an existing structure, located within a designated urban renewal area as defined in § 11-8-4, if the new structure, addition, renovation, or reconstruction has a full and true value of thirty thousand dollars or more;
- (2) Any new industrial structure, including a power generation facility, or an addition to an existing structure, if the new structure or addition has a full and true value of thirty thousand dollars or more;
- (3) Any new nonresidential agricultural structure, or any addition to an existing structure, if the new structure or addition has a full and true value of ten thousand dollars or more;
- (4) Any new commercial structure, or any addition to an existing structure, except a commercial residential structure as described in subdivision (5), if the new structure or addition has a full and true value of thirty thousand dollars or more;
- (5) Any new commercial residential structure, or addition to an existing structure, containing four or more units, if the new structure or addition has a full and true value of thirty thousand dollars or more;
- (6) Any new affordable housing structure containing four or more units with a monthly rental rate of the units at or below the annually calculated rent for the state's sixty percent area median income being used by the South Dakota Housing Development Authority, for a minimum of ten years following the date of first occupancy, if the structure has a full and true value of thirty thousand dollars or more;
- (7) Any new residential structure, or addition to or renovation of an existing structure, located within a redevelopment neighborhood established pursuant to § 10-6-56 if the new structure, addition, or renovation has a full and true value of five thousand dollars or more. The structure shall be located in an area defined and designated as a redevelopment neighborhood based on conditions provided in § 11-7-2 or 11-7-3: or
- (8) Any commercial, industrial, or nonresidential agricultural property which increases more than ten thousand dollars in full and true value as a result of reconstruction or renovation of the structure.

Section 2. That § 10-6-35.1 be REPEALED.

10-6-35.1. New industrial structures and additions specifically classified for tax purposes.

Section 3. That § 10-6-35.3 be REPEALED.

10-6-35.3. Pollution standards to qualify for construction tax incentive.

Section 4. That § 10-6-35.4 be AMENDED:

10-6-35.4. Municipal adoption of reduction for new property.

If the board of county commissioners of a county has not adopted a formula pursuant to § 10-6-35.2, the governing board of a municipality where the structures defined in § 10-6-35.2 are located, or within three miles of the corporate limits of the municipality may in the governing board's discretion adopt all or any part of the formula for assessed value pursuant to § 10-6-35.2 or 10-6-55.

Section 5. That § 10-6-35.19 be REPEALED.

10-6-35.19. Nonresidential property--Increased value due to reconstruction or renovation--Special classification.

Section 6. That §§ 10-6-35.21 to 10-6-35.22 be REPEALED.

Section 7. That § 10-6-35.23 be AMENDED:

10-6-35.23. Adoption of assessed value formula by governing board of improvement district.

If the board of county commissioners of a county has not adopted a formula pursuant to § 10-6-35.2, the governing board of an improvement district where the structures defined in subdivision 10-6-35.2(2) are located may adopt all or any part of the formula for assessed value pursuant to § 10-6-35.2.

Section 8. That §§ 10-6-35.24 to 10-6-35.26 be REPEALED.

Section 9. That §§ 10-6-54 to 10-6-55 be REPEALED.

Section 10. That § 10-6-56 be AMENDED:

10-6-56. Boundaries of redevelopment neighborhood.

The board of county commissioners or the municipal governing body that approves the adoption of a reduced valuation pursuant to subdivision 10-6-35.2(7) shall, by ordinance, identify the exact boundaries of the redevelopment neighborhood where the reduced valuation will be available.

Section 11. That § 13-13-20.4 be AMENDED:

13-13-20.4. Actual assessed valuation for certain property given reduced valuation.

For any property given a reduced valuation pursuant to § 10-6-35.2 or 10-6-67, the portion of actual assessed valuation of the property used when calculating state aid to education shall be twenty percent in the first year, forty percent in the second year, sixty percent in the third year, eighty percent in the fourth year, and one hundred percent each year thereafter. In addition, the actual assessed valuation of any property given exempt status pursuant to § 10-4-39 shall be used when calculating state aid to education.

Section 12. That § 9-54-8 be AMENDED:

9-54-8. Lease or sale payments sufficient to pay bonds and costs--Payments in lieu of property taxes.

Revenue agreements pursuant to § 9-54-3.1 shall provide for contractual payments sufficient to pay the principal, premium, if any, and interest on any bonds issued by the municipality under the resolution or ordinance or trust indenture, when due or subject to mandatory redemption, and also to pay all taxes, special assessments and other governmental charges levied or imposed with respect to the project, and to pay all costs of insurance, operation, and maintenance thereof. The agreements shall also reimburse the municipality for the cost of any other obligation assumed by the municipality in connection with the project. Revenue agreements in the form of a lease or sale contract shall further provide for payment of a sum equal to the amount of property taxes which would be due if the lessee or purchaser were the owner of the project, to be prorated among the taxing districts involved and taking into consideration reductions permitted pursuant to § 10-6-35.2 for the term of the agreement.

Section 13. That § 10-12-44 be AMENDED:

10-12-44. County auditor in school district to raise additional revenue from real property taxes to compensate for tax abatement, tax increment financing district, or discretionary formula.

The county auditor in each school district shall raise additional revenue, for the general fund and special education fund, from real property taxes to compensate for a tax abatement, a tax increment financing district, or a discretionary formula as follows:

- (1) For tax increment financing districts created pursuant to chapter 11-9 the county auditor shall impose an additional tax levy for an amount not to exceed an amount equal to the sum of the levies in §§ 10-12-42 and 13-37-16 times the tax increment valuation as defined in § 11-9-1;
- (2) For property subject to § 10-6-35.2 or 10-6-67, the county auditor shall impose an additional tax levy for an amount not to exceed the amount of taxes that were not collected due to the reduction in valuation based on the maximum levies pursuant to §§ 10-12-42 and 13-37-16; and
- (3) For abated taxes the county auditor shall impose an additional tax levy for an amount not to exceed the amount of the school district's portion of the taxes that were abated pursuant to chapter 10-18 during the previous tax year.

The levies in this section are not subject to the referendum provision of § 10-12-43 and these levies shall maintain the same proportion to each other as represented in the mathematical relationship at the maximum levies pursuant to § 10-12-42.

Section 14. That § 11-9-20 be AMENDED:

11-9-20. Determination of tax increment base of district.

On application in writing by the municipal finance officer, on a form prescribed by the department, the department shall determine the aggregate assessed value of the taxable property in the district, which aggregate assessed value, on certification to the finance officer, shall constitute the tax increment base of the district. Except as provided for in § 11-9-20.1, the department shall use the values as last previously certified by the department adjusted for the value to the date the district was created for any buildings or additions completed or removed and without regard to any reduction pursuant to §§ 1-19A-20, 10-6-35.2, and 10-6-67.

Section 15. That a NEW SECTION be added:

10-6-35.27. Real property receiving discretionary formula prior to July 1, 2020.

2020plat013: Lawrence and Pat Jensen are platting off 4.3 acres that contain a residence and building site from the 40.0 acres they own. The residence was built in 2014. They will use the existing driveway located on 213th Street for access to the property. The building site needs to be excluded from the 40 acres, with a separate legal description for financial purposes. Their son is purchasing the balance 35.7 acres, along with the additional 120 acres of farmland in the quarter, to continue the family farming operation. Included in this report is a letter from the financial institution, with what is required. This plat request is quite different from other building site subdivisions in the past, where the smaller parcel is required for financing of that small parcel, in this case, the subdivision is required for the financing of the large parcel of farm ground, without the 4.3 acre building site. The current owner's will continue to live in the building site and help with the farming operation.

The plat meets the platting requirements for the 2016 Comprehensive Plan-Unincorporated Rural Area Land Use statement on page 24 for Agricultural Land Use.

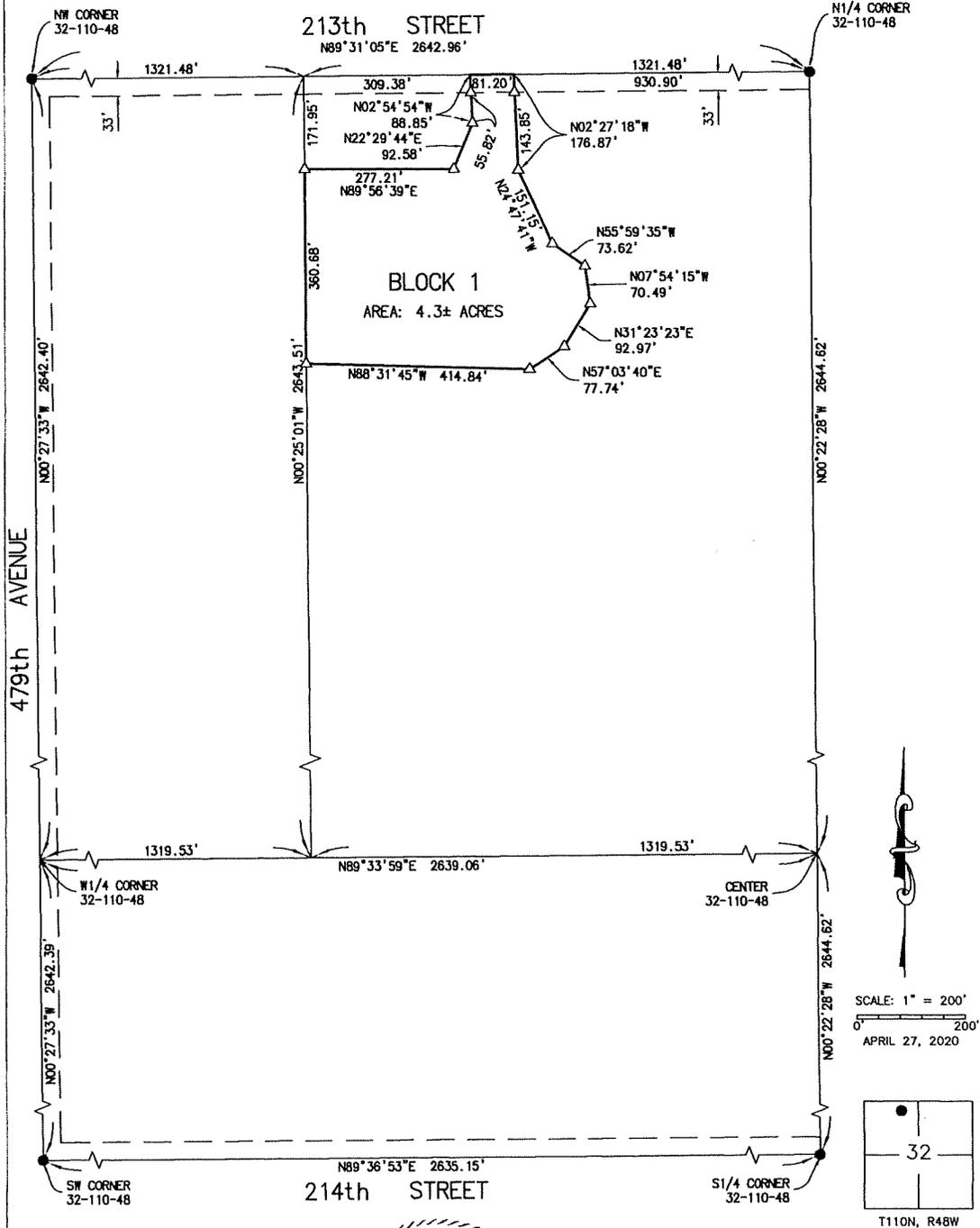

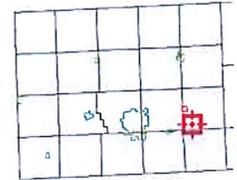


Block 1 - Jensen Addition

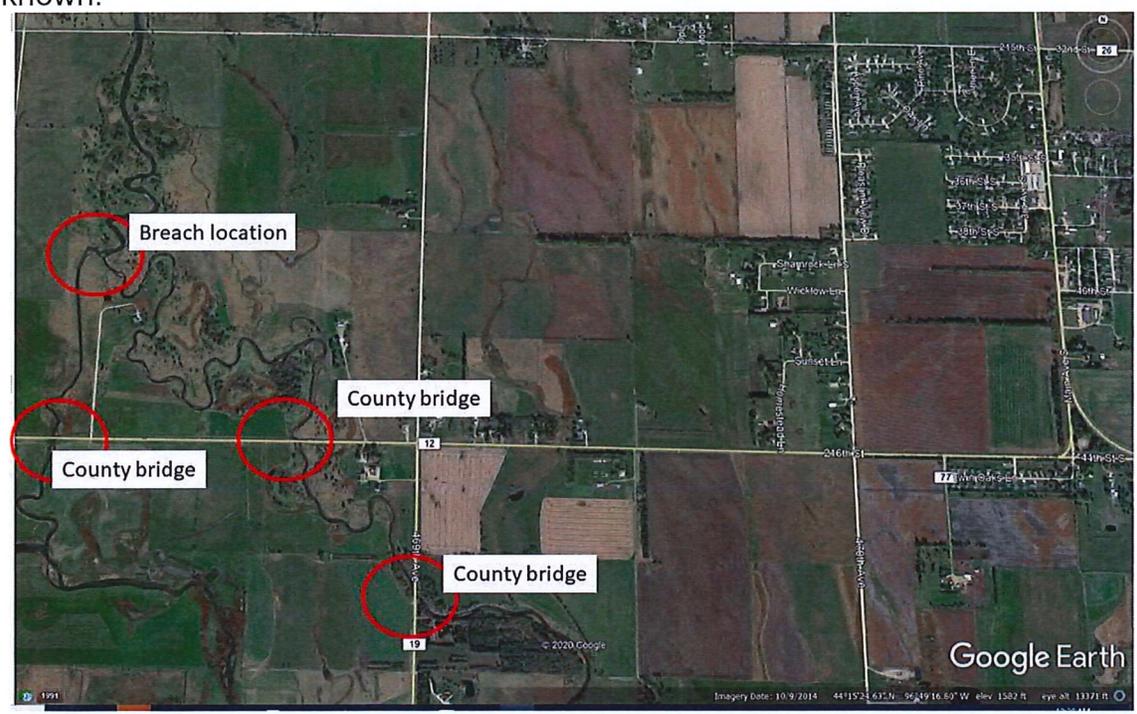

The Big Sioux River is a meandering river that flows through the approximate center of Brookings County and flows southward toward the Missouri River.

In Medary Township there is a location where a breach has occurred, the actual date is not known.



The Brookings County Commission acting as the Brookings County Drainage Commission has been discussing this area since 2011. The biggest hurdle to date has been federal land easements on properties that could be affected if the breach is repaired to a previous state.

With a new emphasis on infrastructure in the county and a steady degradation of the roads in this area Banner Associates was contacted to see if they could assist the county with contacting the federal agencies involved so that we can determine what to do to remedy the issue.

The minutes from a June 3, 2020 meeting held at the City/County Building and via teleconference are as follows:

Present were Kent Johnson with Banner Associates, Brian Gustad with Brookings County Highway Department, Ryan Krogman Brookings County Commission, Mike Bartley Brookings County Commission, Robert Hill Brookings County Development Director, Richard Haugen Brookings County Development Deputy Director. Those in attendance by phone were: Becky Baker with Banner Associates, Deb Springman with East Dakota Water District and Rob Hexum with Medary Township.

Bob Hill called the meeting to order and introduced all who were in attendance. Kent Johnson discussed his recent correspondence with Natural Resources Conservation District regarding existing easements breached dike north of 216th St. They are open to discussion on repair options for the dike and would like options from the county and the township. The group discussed that Medary Township voted on March 5, 2019 at their annual Township meeting to return the River to levels it was on January 1, 2009.

Discussion was held on how the county bridges, highway and farm ground has been impacted by the majority of the river flow going to the west of the main river channel. It was determined to do a "Feasibility Memo Study" a preliminary step that would provide a lot of information with regards to flows, maintaining easements and design options. Banner's was going to prepare a cost for the Feasibility Study and get back to Bob, so he can get it scheduled on the County Commission agenda for possible action.

Dear Mr. Hill:

Banner Associates, Inc. ("Banner") is pleased to submit this letter of contract for Engineering and Environmental Services for the above referenced project within Medary Township and Brookings County, South Dakota. See Attachment 1 for the project location. It is our understanding the hydrology of the Big Sioux River changed in this area after 2011, causing flooding of farmland and concerns for the transportation infrastructure. Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) wetland easements are present in the area and the wetlands and waterways are also jurisdictional under US Army Corp of Engineer (USACE) regulations.

Scope of Services:

1. A feasibility memo will be completed to determine if a feasible option is present to address the issues with the hydrology shift of the Big Sioux River in this area.
 - a. Purpose and Need for the Project- Banner will work with Brookings County and Medary Township to identify the needs to consider options for a structure that would return the hydrology in this area to conditions that existed prior to the diversion channel dike washing out.
 - b. Survey cross sections for the main channel and diversion channel. A limited topographical survey will be necessary in the location where a dike once existed. A structure survey of any residential and non-residential homes will also include the structures at 2502 W 44th Street South, Brookings, SD (Rolfe Behrend).
 - c. Options- Banner will consider up to three options. No preliminary design will be completed, a concept for each option will be described and utilized to consider impacts to floodplain, wetlands and waterways.
 - i. Option 1- Constructing an earth dike at the location noted on Attachment 1.
 - ii. Option 2- Constructing a controlled outlet at the location noted on Attachment 1.
 - iii. Option 3- Constructing a dike in the right-of-way of 216th Street.
 - d. Impacts to Floodplain and Wetlands and Waterways. Banner will consider the impacts to these areas by each of the three options. The following further clarifies the analysis:
 - i. Floodplain
 1. A 2D hydraulic model will be run to quantify the change in surface water flow and surface water elevations between the existing conditions and

options. The model will be based on 2012 LIDAR elevation information and survey data. The model terrain will be modified for each option.

2. Hydrological scenarios used for the hydraulic model input will include:
 - a. A low flow as determined by NRCS methods, and
 - b. 100-year rain-on-grid rainfall event.
 - ii. Wetlands and Waterways
 1. Complete a desktop delineation to determine the areas of wetland and Ordinary High Watermark (OHWM) for the waterways. Show the boundaries on figures within the memo.
 2. Review the NRCS wetland easements provided by Brookings County or Township. Will identify the requirements within the easement language and the wetland areas that are protected under the easement. Show the easements on a figure within the memo.
 3. Calculate the acres of wetland and waterway impacted due to each option. The calculations will be based on the hydraulic analysis and desktop wetland delineation.
 - iii. Matrix that shows the impacts due to each option to floodplain and wetlands; a discussion of Banner's recommendation on if a feasible option is present and what the potential costs for wetland mitigation would be.
2. Project Coordination- Banner will complete the following coordination:
- a. Coordinate with Brookings County and Township to identify the needs for the project and gather information for reference.
 - b. Coordinate with NRCS and USACE to discuss the proposed methodology to determine impacts to wetlands and waterways due to the proposed options. This will include a meeting with staff from NRCS headquarters during the project. Assumes meetings will be held via video conference.
 - c. Discuss with USACE potential impacts to wetlands and waterways, discuss permitting that will be required.
 - d. Coordinate with Brookings County and Medary Township to discuss results of the memo and explain the impacts each option would have on floodplain, wetlands and waterways.
 - e. Meet with NRCS and discuss the recommended option and results of analysis if an option is determined to be feasible.

Submittals:

A draft feasibility memo will be provided for review by Brookings County and Township. A final feasibility memo will be provided that addresses any comments received.

Exclusions:

Based on our understanding of the project, the following items are excluded from our Scope of Services:

- Geotechnical Investigation,
- Field wetland delineation and Environmental Assessment Document



- County, State, and Federal permitting or Drainage Board approval,
- Hazardous Materials,
- Historical Records Search,
- Construction Staking,
- Construction Administration Services.

Client Obligations:

- Provide NRCS wetland easement documents.
- Obtain right-of-entry for Banner Associates staff

Engineering Services Compensation:

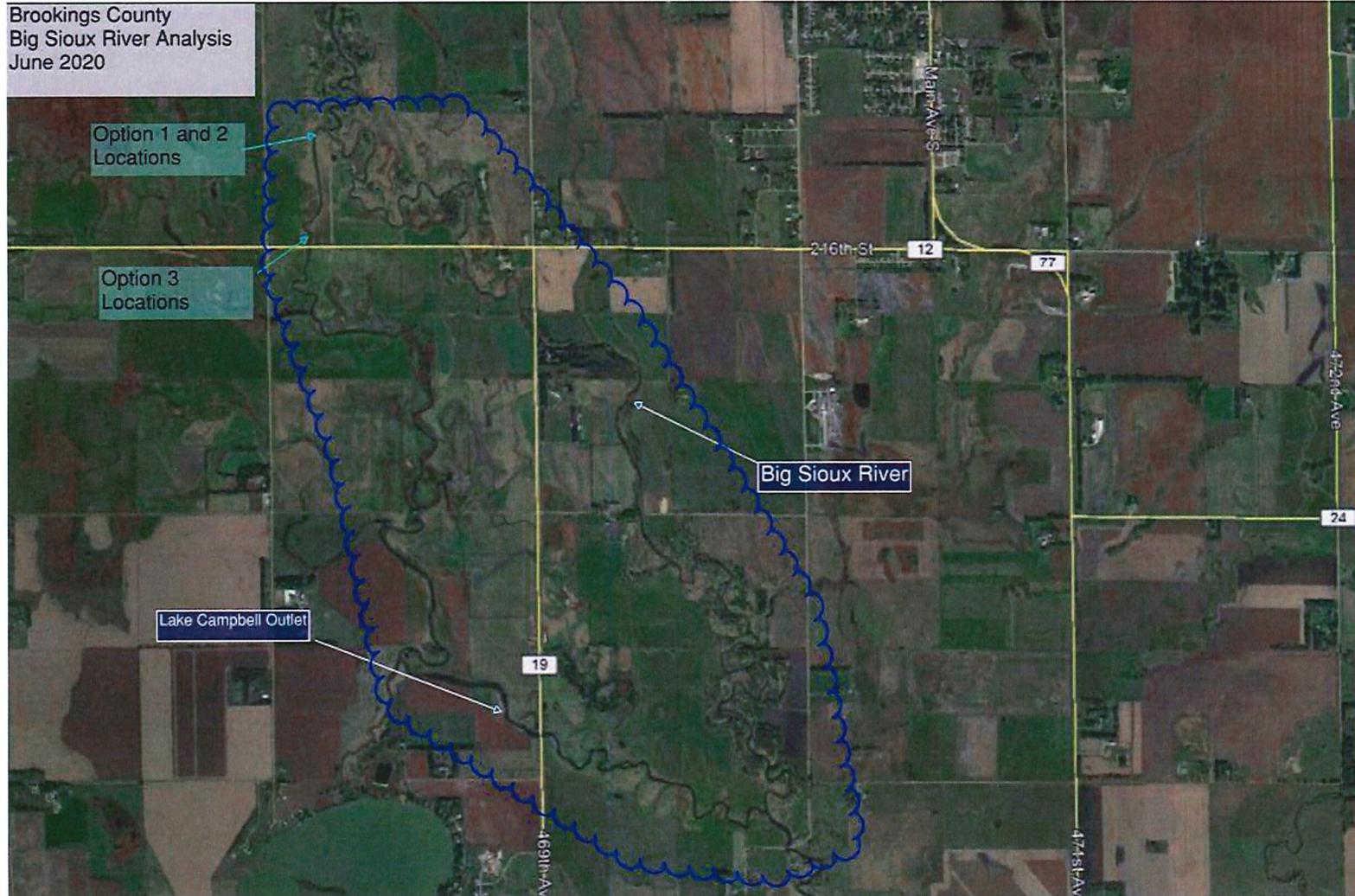

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is by and between Brookings County (“Owner”) and
TopKote Inc. (“Contractor”).

Owner and Contractor hereby agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1 – WORK

- 1.01 *The Contractor shall perform all Work associated with the construction of this Project as set forth in the Contract Documents. The scope of Work shall include all labor, materials, equipment, tools, services, and the like required by the Contract Documents or otherwise necessary for the completion of the Project. The Contract Items shall include those Bid Items indicated on the Notice of Award with the estimated quantities and unit prices listed in the accepted Bid Schedule.*
- 1.02 Contractor shall complete all Work as specified or indicated in the Contract Documents. The Work is generally described as follows:
- A. Prepare roads immediately before chip sealing; sweep roads, clean all entrances back to grass line and beyond to ROW line if asphalt surfaced at intersecting roads, driveways and mailbox pullouts, clean any foreign properties stuck to road surface.
 - B. Provide double covered centerline marking tabs prior to asphalt surface treatment.
 - C. Provide traffic control, safety trained flagging personnel, & road work signing during the construction process.
 - D. Provide equipment for application of CRS-2P emulsion at the rate of minimum .32 up to +.06 gallon per square yard (Liquid Asphalt rate to be determined by Highway Superintendent) between grass lines; centerline to be swept back to have sufficient overlap for complete coverage; contractor to check all roadway widths; intersecting radius areas, mailbox pullouts, entrances/pullouts are to be chip sealed within the project limits—County & Contractor to coordinate.
 - E. Contractor shall be responsible for ordering liquid asphalt from Brookings County’s supplier and will be responsible for demurrage charges, returned load charges, and less than minimum material delivery charges. Any freight and/or pumping charges are the responsibility of the Contractor. 1 paper copy of the bill of lading shall be provided to Brookings County upon delivery. (Liquid Asphalt provided by Brookings County)
 - F. Provide equipment to Screen (If needed), load & haul chips from chip pile locations (provided on attached map) and apply 3/8” Type 1a granite stone chips or 3/8” Type 1b natural stone chips @ the rate of 21± lbs. per sq. yd. (Chips provided by Brookings County in stock pile, pounds per sq. yd. to be determined by Highway Superintendent)
 - G. Provide equipment for rolling chips immediately after chips have been placed; rolling to conform to 2015 SD Standard Specifications for Roads & Bridges 360.3 B. 4.
 - H. Sweep chips off roads after a 24 waiting period & within 48 hours after the waiting period—roads to be swept in mornings under cooler temperatures; some sweeping will require

directional—one-way sweeping; no chips are to be swept onto manicured lawn areas—
Brookings County & Contractor to visually inspect & coordinate before sweeping.

- I. Temperatures to be 65+ degrees & all road surfaces dry before application of liquid asphalt. Chip seal operations are allowed in daylight hours only; no operations while dark.
- J. Contractor shall monitor project for 12 hours after completion for any oil tracking, bleeding or if wet weather is forecast— contractor will keep traffic off the project if any oil pickup is occurring; contractor will maintain this traffic control until traffic can safely travel project with no oil pickup; the contractors liability insurance will be responsible for vehicle cleaning if oil pickup occurs—contractor will monitor for oil bleeding at the same time and blot with sand if necessary.
- K. No work will be allowed to be performed on Sunday.

ARTICLE 2 – THE PROJECT

- 2.01 The Project, of which the Work under the Contract Documents is a part, is generally described as follows: ***2020 Brookings County Chip Seal Project.***

ARTICLE 4 – CONTRACT TIMES

4.01 *Time of the Essence*

All time limits for Milestones, if any, Substantial Completion, and completion and readiness for final payment as stated in the Contract Documents are of the essence of the Contract.

4.02 *Contract Times: Days and Dates*

- A. The Work will be substantially completed ***on or before August 22, 2020. Furthermore, the Notice to Proceed will not be issued before June 15, 2020. The work will be*** completed and ready for final payment in accordance with Paragraph 15.06 of the General Conditions ***on or before thirty (30) calendar days have expired from the date the Owner determines the Work to be substantially complete.***

4.03 *Liquidated Damages*

- A. Contractor and Owner recognize that time is of the essence as stated in Paragraph 4.01 above and that Owner will suffer financial and other losses if the Work is not completed and Milestones not achieved within the times specified in Paragraph 4.02 above, plus any extensions thereof allowed in accordance with the Contract. The parties also recognize the delays, expense, and difficulties involved in proving in a legal or arbitration proceeding the actual loss suffered by Owner if the Work is not completed on time. Accordingly, instead of requiring any such proof, Owner and Contractor agree that as liquidated damages for delay (but not as a penalty):

- 1. Substantial Completion: ***The amount according to the Schedule of Liquidated Damages below shall be deducted from the amount due or that may become due the Contractor***

for each day that expires after the time (as duly adjusted pursuant to the Contract) specified in Paragraph 4.02.A above for Substantial Completion until the Work is substantially complete.

2. Completion of Remaining Work: After Substantial Completion, if Contractor shall neglect, refuse, or fail to complete the remaining Work within the Contract Time (as duly adjusted pursuant to the Contract) for completion and readiness for final payment, **Owner shall deduct from final pay request the amount according to the Schedule of Liquidated Damages below** for each day that expires after such time until the Work is completed and ready for final payment.
3. Liquidated damages for failing to timely attain Substantial Completion and final completion are not additive and will not be imposed concurrently.

- B. Owner shall make progress payments on account of the Contract Price on the basis of Contractor's Applications for Payment each month during performance of the Work as provided in Paragraph 6.02.A.1 below, provided that such Applications for Payment have been submitted in a timely manner and otherwise meet the requirements of the Contract. All such payments will be measured by the Schedule of Values established as provided in the General Conditions (and in the case of Unit Price Work based on the number of units completed) or, in the event there is no Schedule of Values, as provided elsewhere in the Contract.
1. Prior to Substantial Completion, progress payments will be made in an amount equal to the percentage indicated below but, in each case, less the aggregate of payments previously made and less such amounts as Owner may withhold, including but not limited to liquidated damages, in accordance with the Contract
 - a. 90 percent of Work completed (with the balance being retainage). If the Work has been 50 percent completed as determined by Owner, and if the character and progress of the Work have been satisfactory to Owner, ***Owner may determine that as*** long as the character and progress of the Work remain satisfactory to Owner, there will be no additional retainage; and
 - b. 90 percent of cost of materials and equipment not incorporated in the Work ***in accordance with paragraph 6.02.A.1.c below*** (with the balance being retainage).
 - c. ***If payment is requested on the basis of materials and equipment not incorporated in the Work but delivered and suitably stored at or near the site, the partial payment estimate shall also be accompanied by such supporting data, satisfactory to the Owner, as will establish the Owner's title to the material and equipment and protect his interest therein, including applicable insurance. Partial***

progress payments will be made upon written request by the Contractor on specific items as listed herein which are stockpiled in a manner and location satisfactory to the Engineer. All material for which an allowance is requested shall be stored in an approved manner in areas where damage from flood waters is not likely to occur. If at any time stored materials are lost or become damaged by floods, or in any other manner, the Contractor will be responsible for repair and replacement of such damaged materials. If payment has been made prior to such damage, the amount so allowed or a proportionate part thereof shall be deducted from the next partial payment and withheld until satisfactory repairs or replacements have been made. No payment on stockpiled materials as specified herein shall be made on fuel, hardware such as bolts, plates, etc., supplies, form lumber, false work, perishable materials, or on temporary structures of any kind which will not become an integral part of the finished construction, nor on items when unit bid prices are obviously unbalanced as compared to the Engineer's estimated unit prices prepared prior to the letting.

- B. Upon Substantial Completion, Owner shall pay an amount sufficient to increase total payments to Contractor to **95** percent of the Work completed, less such amounts set off by Owner pursuant to Paragraph 15.01.E of the General Conditions, and less **200** percent of the estimated of the value of Work to be completed or corrected as shown on the punch list of items to be completed or corrected prior to final payment.

6.03 *Final Payment*

- A. Upon final completion and acceptance of the Work in accordance with Paragraph 15.06 of the General Conditions, Owner shall pay the remainder of the Contract Price as recommended by Engineer as provided in said Paragraph 15.06.

ARTICLE 7 – INTEREST

- 7.01 All amounts not paid when due shall bear interest *per State of South Dakota law*.

ARTICLE 8 – CONTRACTOR’S REPRESENTATIONS

- 8.01 In order to induce Owner to enter into this Contract, Contractor makes the following representations:
 - A. Contractor has examined and carefully studied the Contract Documents, and any data and reference items identified in the Contract Documents.
 - B. Contractor has visited the Site, conducted a thorough, alert visual examination of the Site and adjacent areas, and become familiar with and is satisfied as to the general, local, and Site conditions that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
 - C. Contractor is familiar with and is satisfied as to all Laws and Regulations that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
 - D. Contractor has carefully studied all: (1) reports of explorations and tests of subsurface conditions at or adjacent to the Site and all drawings of physical conditions relating to existing surface or subsurface structures at the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, especially with respect to Technical Data in such reports and drawings, and (2) reports and drawings relating to Hazardous Environmental Conditions, if any, at or adjacent

to the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, especially with respect to Technical Data in such reports and drawings.

- E. Contractor has considered the information known to Contractor itself; information commonly known to contractors doing business in the locality of the Site; information and observations obtained from visits to the Site; the Contract Documents; and the Site-related reports and drawings identified in the Contract Documents, with respect to the effect of such information, observations, and documents on (1) the cost, progress, and performance of the Work; (2) the means, methods, techniques, sequences, and procedures of construction to be employed by Contractor; and (3) Contractor's safety precautions and programs.
- F. Based on the information and observations referred to in the preceding paragraph, Contractor agrees that no further examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies, or data are necessary for the performance of the Work at the Contract Price, within the Contract Times, and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Contract.
- G. Contractor is aware of the general nature of work to be performed by Owner and others at the Site that relates to the Work as indicated in the Contract Documents.
- H. Contractor has given Engineer written notice of all conflicts, errors, ambiguities, or discrepancies that Contractor has discovered in the Contract Documents, and the written resolution thereof by Engineer is acceptable to Contractor.
- I. The Contract Documents are generally sufficient to indicate and convey understanding of all terms and conditions for performance and furnishing of the Work.
- J. Contractor's entry into this Contract constitutes an incontrovertible representation by Contractor that without exception all prices in the Agreement are premised upon performing and furnishing the Work required by the Contract Documents.

Unless expressly agreed to elsewhere in the Contract, no assignment by a party hereto of any rights under or interests in the Contract will be binding on another party hereto without the written consent of the party sought to be bound; and, specifically but without limitation, money that may become due and money that is due may not be assigned without such consent (except to the extent that the effect of this restriction may be limited by law), and unless specifically stated to the contrary in any written consent to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any duty or responsibility under the Contract Documents.

10.03 *Successors and Assigns*

- A. Owner and Contractor each binds itself, its successors, assigns, and legal representatives to the other party hereto, its successors, assigns, and legal representatives in respect to all covenants, agreements, and obligations contained in the Contract Documents.

10.04 *Severability*

- A. 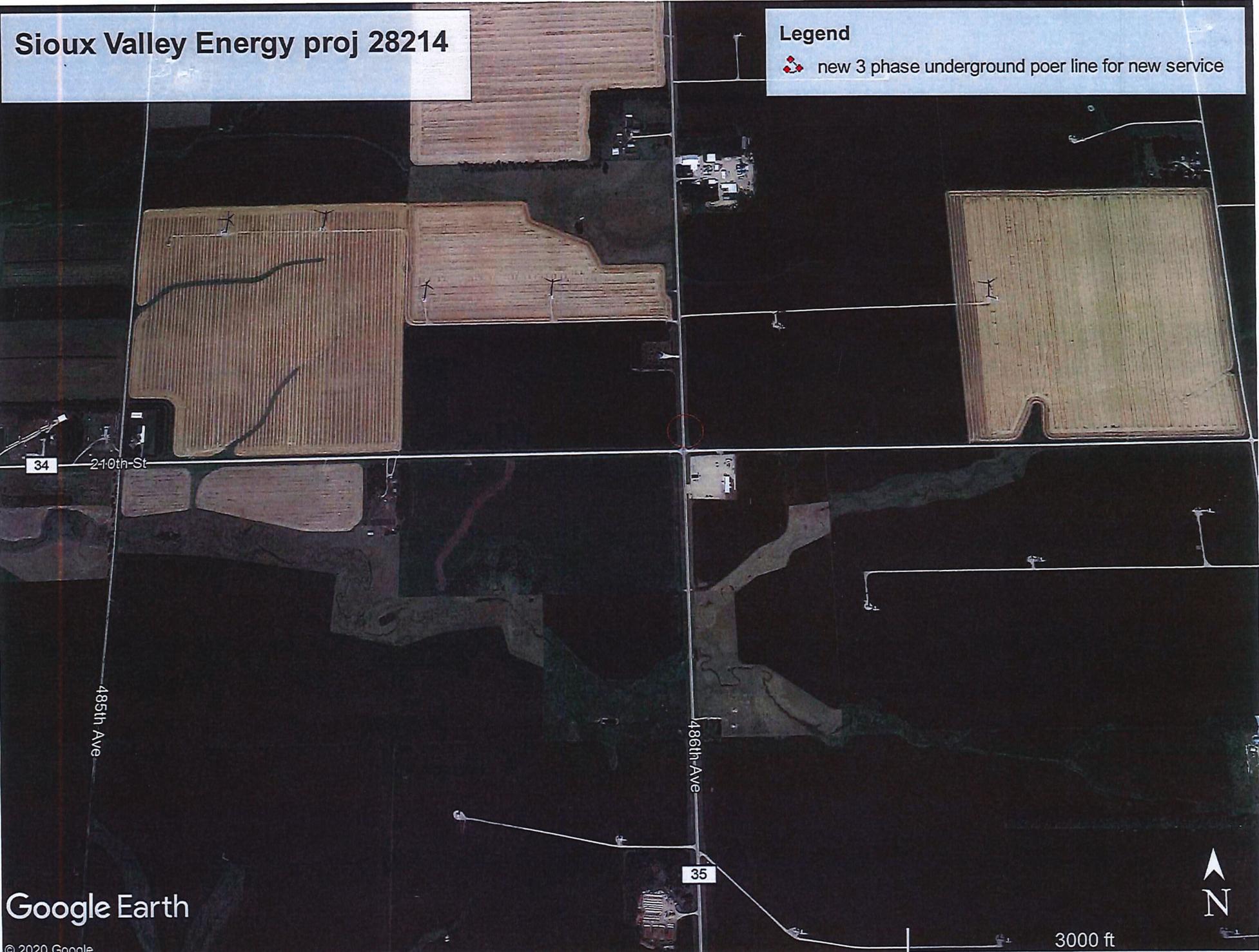

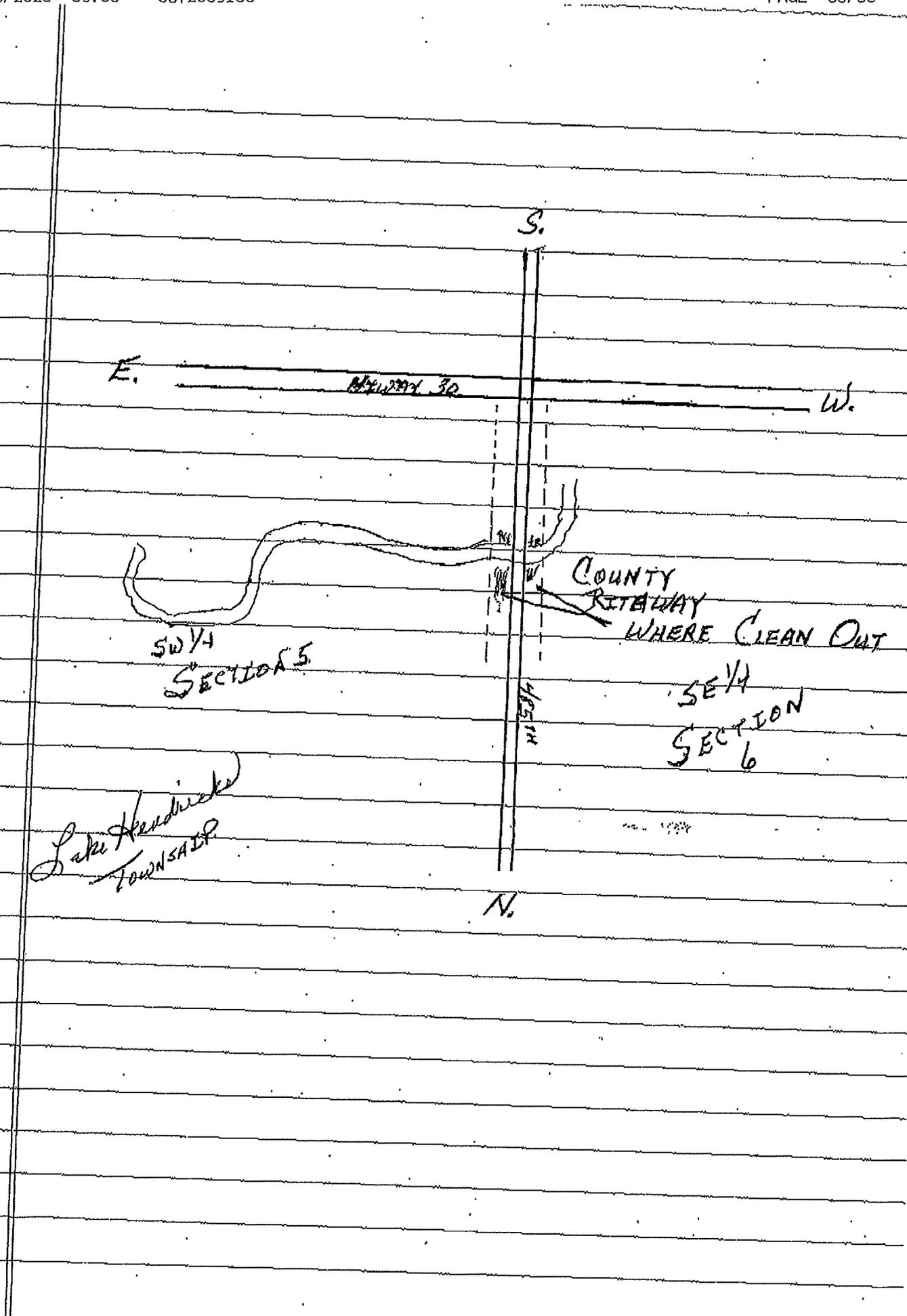

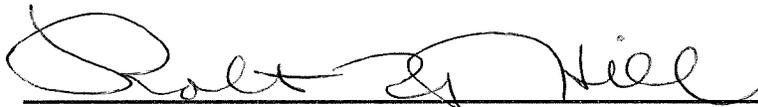

DESCRIPTION OF WORK

General Statement of Duties

The fundamental reason this position exists is to perform duties assigned in the areas of the legal process to include: direct supervision and well being of prisoners in the Detention Center, ensures that all Detention Center procedures are carefully followed and monitored. Resolves prisoner complaints/requests within procedural guidelines. Transports prisoners as required and other Detention Center duties as assigned.

Note—It is the primary responsibility that all Correctional Officers ensure that the Detention Center is operating in a peaceful manner and that physical confrontation with inmates is a real possibility on any given day to ensure proper operations.

Note—Part-time Correctional Officers are hired contingent upon fulfilling the needs of the Detention Center. Incumbents are not on a set schedule but are hired to fulfill the scheduling needs as they arise. It is an essential function of the position to be able to work during all shifts, odd hours, emergency situations, holidays, etc.

Examples of Duties: (Any one position may not include all of the duties listed, nor do the listed examples include all duties which may be found in positions of this grade.)

- Assist with the supervision, security, and conduct of inmates at the County Correctional Detention Center including the supervision of inmates during transport to other facilities or services.
- Assist in all operations of control of the detention center.
- Admit and release prisoners to include searching inmates and property and making inventory of the personal property of the prisoners.
- Book and discharge inmates; issue clothing and supplies to new inmates; arrange for inmate transportation, if necessary; maintain inmate and detention records.
- Fingerprint and photograph inmates; type FBI and DCI fingerprint cards.
- Classify incoming inmates and place them in proper cells.
- Deliver meals and assist in meal preparation.
- Disperse medication to prisoners as directed by a medical professional.
- Assist in the cleaning of the jail areas. Ensure that cells, facilities, and grounds are kept sanitary.
- Assist with computer jail entries.
- Check on inmates on a routine and regular basis.
- Assist in jail safety and security procedures to include the control of weapons, contraband, keys, tools, doors, and other related safety and security precautions.
- Oversee the inmate's daily exercise and recreation routine.
- Promote acceptable attitudes and behaviors of inmates to assist them in adjusting to a confinement setting.
- Respond to inquiries regarding inmate detention and Correctional Facility policies within the constraints of Department regulations.
- Operate equipment and utilize teletype communications.
- Testify in court and before County Commission.
- Attend training sessions and meetings as required.
- Perform work in a manner consistent with safe practices.
- Develop and maintain positive, professional relationships with the general public and other employees.
- Perform other such duties and functions as assigned and necessary to the proper performance of the position.

STAFF REPORT:

Scheduled Agenda Items

- 9:00 AM – Aurora Gala Days: Pat Tingle will be at the meeting to request the closure of a portion of Broadway Avenue (County Road 23) in Aurora for Gala Days on August 1st starting at 6:00 AM until August 2nd at 3:00 AM. A map of the proposed detour route is included in the packet.
- 9:05 AM – Preston Township: Preston Township Supervisor Barry Loomis will be at the meeting to discuss and request county assistance with a township road that is being encroached upon by the Big Sioux River. There are several pictures that Mr. Loomis sent included in the packet.

Regular Business Items

- ❖ Director of Equalization Resolutions: There are four resolutions that speak to the discretionary formula. There are no substantive changes to these resolutions. However, the codified law that was referenced in the previous resolutions was changed during this year's legislative session through HB 1259 and the new law goes into effect on July 1, 2020. I've included the previous resolutions and HB 1259 in the packet, as well.
- ❖ Plats: The Planning Commission unanimously approved these four plats at their June 3, 2020 meeting. Richard Haugen provided a staff report with each one.
- ❖ Abatement: There is one application for an abatement due to a home moved off the lot in question. The amount requested is \$21.79.
- ❖ Feasibility Study Memo: This is an agreement with Banner Associates to conduct a study on the area where there was a dike breached by the Big Sioux River south of Brookings in Medary Township. The amount of the study would cost up to \$40,000. Because this is a drainage issue, that is the budget that makes the most sense to code this expense out of. However, that budget has only \$746 remaining. We could take it out of Commission – professional services, which has about \$28,000 left in it. But that's also our budget line for paying our attorney fees. This will more than likely require contingency at year end no matter what budget is used.
- ❖ Chip Seal Agreement: This is an agreement with TopKote, Inc. to do the chip sealing in the county. Brian Gustad can answer questions on this. I believe it is a budgeted item.
- ❖ Right-of-Way Agreements: There are four routine right-of-way agreements that have been approved by Brian Gustad or Jeff Anderson.
- ❖ Township Grants: We had two grant applications submitted. Oak Lake and Volga Townships submitted grant applications for culverts totaling \$10,535.13. Brian has been to these sites and is recommending approval. This leaves \$89,464.87 in the budget for additional projects. I did send out a second round of letters to the townships with a new deadline of July 31st.
- ❖ Generator: In reviewing the need for a generator at the BCOAC – the small generator that Emergency Management has now would power a very minimal portion of the building. We need direction from the board if they would like us to research what it would cost to purchase and install a generator that could power more of the building, including the heating and cooling systems, if the building were to be needed as a Red Cross Shelter. More than likely, this would need to be a budgeted item in FY2021. The other options are to move forward using the current generator, or do nothing. Dustin, Bob and I hope to have additional information by Tuesday.

- ❖ Automatic Supplement: This is to supplement the Emergency Management budget for reimbursement for the Pre-Disaster Mitigation Plan.
- ❖ Request to Fill Vacancy: This is for an internal-only posting for a full-time male correctional officer.
- ❖ Appointment Policy: This the current policy, in written form, of what we do for citizen board appointments. I want to get this officially approved by the board.
- ❖ Work Plan: I have updated the Work Plan. The changes are noted in pink.

Director's Report

- The General Fund surplus comparison information is included with my report. We are right at the 10-year average at just shy of 41%.

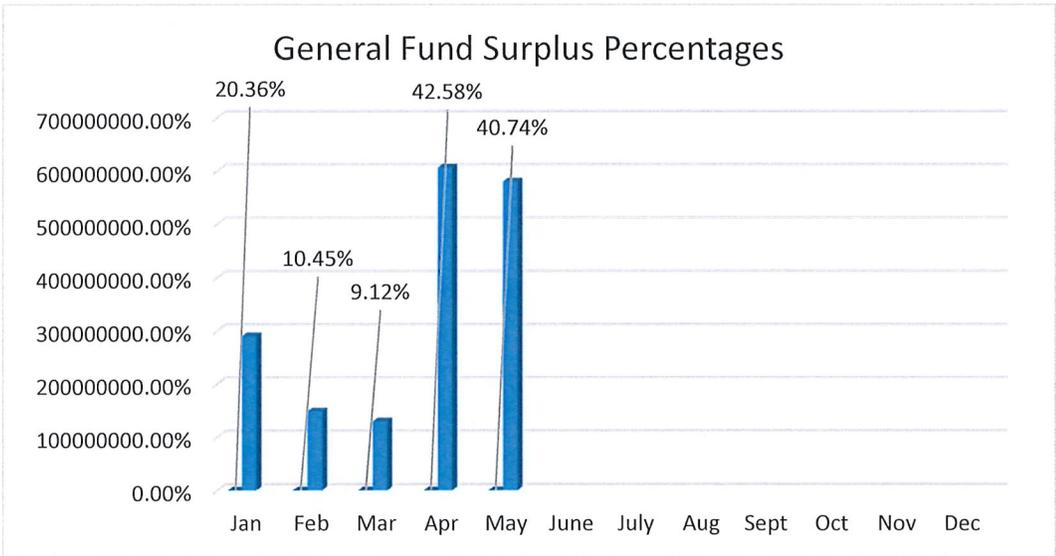

The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) received your request to add the field listed in the following table to your approved nutrient management plan (NMP). Your existing NMP is part of your application for state permit coverage under the 2017 *General Water Pollution Control Permit for Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations* (general permit). Your animal feeding operation was originally approved on August 27, 2018, and permitted on 06/14/2019. You received state permit coverage under the 2017 general permit on June 14, 2019 (**State Permit # SDG-100557**).

The new field is not located within ¼ mile of a stream where Topeka shiners have been observed or have potentially occupied according to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

As part of your annual nutrient management planning requirements, soil and manure tests must be analyzed by certified soil testing and manure testing labs. The laboratory analyzing the soil samples must participate in the **North American Proficiency Testing Programs' Proficiency Assessment Program** and the labs that are currently certified are listed on the following website: <http://www.naptprogram.org/pap>. The laboratory analyzing the manure or process wastewater must be certified by the **Manure Testing Laboratory Certification Program** and the manure testing labs that are currently certified are listed on the following website: <http://www2.mda.state.mn.us/webapp/lis/manurelabs.jsp>.

If you or your crop consultant sends your soil or manure samples to a lab that is not listed on either of these websites, you and/or crop consultant may want to tell them that you need to use a certified lab so they can become certified.

The land application sites must be located at least 150 feet from a private well owned by you, 250 feet from a private well not owned by you and 1,000 feet from any public supply well or other public drinking water source. These setback distances from identified wells cannot be included as part of the land application acreage. Buffer zones are also required around any natural or manmade drainages or wetlands. Please review the buffer zone requirements on the land application maps included with the nutrient management plan in Appendix D of your permit prior to land applying manure.

If a mobile land application system using temporary piping will be used for the land application of liquid manure or process wastewater, the equipment must be equipped with an on-board radio controller and flow meter that can be overseen by the applicator. See Section 1.4.4.1.m. on page 30 of the 2017 general permit for more information on this requirement.

To add fields to your approved phosphorus-based NMP, you must submit the required information for each additional field to the department for our review and approval. Information on adding fields to your approved phosphorus-based NMP may be obtained from your local Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) office. You may also contact us for assistance at (605) 773-3351, or visit our website at <http://denr.sd.gov/des/fp/fieldadditions.aspx> for instructions on adding fields. **You may not apply manure to any fields not included in your approved NMP.**

If manure application will involve placing hoses or other equipment in a state highway right of way (for example, in a road ditch or through a culvert), you must first obtain a Permit to Occupy Right of Way. Application for this permit may be made through the local South Dakota Department

of Transportation area office. Contact your local SD DOT area office for more information on this permit. In addition, please contact your county highway superintendent to determine if your county has similar requirements.

The attached map shows the location of each field. Please review this information and notify the department if any of the information is incorrect. If the enclosed field list and map are correct, please place them in your NMP.
