## **TUESDAY, JULY 21, 2020**

The Brookings County Board of County Commissioners met in regular session on Tuesday, July 21, 2020 with the following members present: Michael Bartley, Larry Jensen, Lee Ann Pierce, Angela Boersma and Ryan Krogman.

### **CALL TO ORDER**

Chairperson Bartley called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

### ***Department Head Reports***

Community Health Nurse Karen Larsen was present to report on the Bi-Annual Commission Report Summary. Larsen said due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, their method of program administration has not ceased, but it has changed slightly. She said they continue to support the families who participate in the WIC program via telephone.

Larsen said they are currently reaching out to families who are not up-to-date on recommended immunizations and offering them an appointment or referring completion of a Well Child visit with their primary care physician.

Larsen said they are in the planning stages for the 2020-2021 school year services.

Larsen said they have a WIC Federal Civil Rights review in August. She also said Brookings County POD will have a flu immunization event in November. Commissioner Pierce asked if that event will be held on campus. Larsen said she believes it will be held at the Swiftel Center.

Highway Superintendent Brian Gustad said chip sealing will begin August 3<sup>rd</sup> for county roads 7, 9, 4, 5 and 35. Gustad said that project will take about 4-5 days.

Gustad updated the board on the bridges on south Highway 77. He said the board will be seeing a change order later in the meeting regarding the completion date. Gustad said Prahm Construction experienced high water levels, which delayed the project and then ran into obstructions, which slowed the progress of the project. He said the new completion date will be November 1<sup>st</sup>.

Finance Officer Vicki Buseth said they are starting to receive levy requests.

Be it noted, the expenditure adjustments for the month of June 2020 were presented to the board. \$2,965.08 was transferred to allocate highway department expenditures to other county departments for work performed and supplies furnished by the highway department.

Be it noted, the Registered of Deeds Statement of Fees collected for the month of June 2020 in the amount of \$46,979.50 was presented to the board.

Sheriff Marty Stanwick said Pioneer Days in White was cancelled but the owners of Corner Gas & Goodies held some of the events at their location. Stanwick said everything went smooth.

Stanwick said they received a complaint on Lake Goldsmith. He said they received a tip that someone drove a snowmobile into the lake. Stanwick said the snowmobile was recovered.

County Development Director Robert Hill said two thunderstorm warnings were issued this week with 2-4 inches of rain being reported along with some hail.

Hill said he attended the NACo General Business Meeting and attended the NACo Board Meeting. Hill also said he attended the PPCC Meeting and reported that there will be a full-scale exercise in November.

Hill said the Census Bureau will be knocking on doors starting August 11<sup>th</sup>.

Hill said a countywide siren test was conducted on July 7<sup>th</sup>.

Hill said Banner Associates started a survey project for Medary Township; he said they are almost finished with it.

Director of Equalization Jacob Brehmer said the Department of Revenue released the top dollar for the productivity method of valuation on agricultural land. He said the crop top dollar this year will be \$3,621.23. Brehmer said top dollar for non-crop or pasture rating will be \$2,166.58. He said the average per acre value of agricultural land is \$2,223.00.

BCOAC Director Dustin Huber reported on attendance at the facility.

He said he and Southpaws Defense, LLC owner Michael Kilmer have scheduled three more pistol classes. Huber said the Safety Picnic is scheduled for Thursday, July 23<sup>rd</sup>.

Huber said Ashley Biggar, a local artist in Brookings, came and painted the windows.

Veterans & Human Services Director Michael Holzhauser said the veteran's side has been very busy.

### **SCHEDULED AGENDA ITEM**

Motion by Pierce, seconded by Krogman to remove Resolution #20-42 from the table. All members voted "aye." Motion carried.

The motion on the table is as follows: Motion by Boersma, seconded by Krogman to approve and authorize Chairperson Bartley to sign Resolution #20-42 as amended: a resolution authorizing the purchase of HVAC systems, installation and service with related products and supplies through Sourcewell.

Commissioner Boersma said she spoke to Ryan Van Der Bill with Associated Consulting Engineering Inc. and said if there were further questions about the chiller system or if the commission wanted an independent 3<sup>rd</sup> party to review the new chiller system, they could do that for approximately \$2,000.00.

Commissioner Pierce asked if there's been any issues with the current chiller not being big enough to cool the facility. Commission Department Director Stacy Steffensen said no, it's just seen its useful life.

Tom Hunstad, Account Manager with Johnson Controls, Inc. said there are no current issues with the chiller; it's becoming age related. Hunstad said the refrigerant is no longer available and hasn't been produced in the U.S. since 2015. He said there are two chillers at the courthouse; one runs and on warmer days the other one kicks on.

Bartley asked which chiller is being replaced. Hunstad said they will replace both chillers with one big one. He said they will be increasing the size of the chiller but using the same electrical system. Bartley asked about the timeline. Hunstad said he would like to do it either September or October. He said the warranty will start when the startup is in effect. Pierce said if it's installed in September and not used until May, the 90 days from date of installation warranty

does not apply. Hunstad said it does not apply, they will move it to May or when startup is in effect.

**WITH RELATED PRODUCTS AND SUPPLIES THROUGH SOURCEWELL**

WHEREAS, Brookings County will need HVAC systems, installation and service with related products and supplies; and

WHEREAS, Sourcewell has gone through a competitive bidding process for HVAC systems, installation and service with related products and supplies with such bidding process culminating in the bids being opened on May 8, 2017 with the bid contract expiring on May 8, 2021;

WHEREAS, Johnson Controls, Inc., was the lowest responsible bidder under such Sourcewell bid process and Johnson Controls, Inc., is willing to provide equipment to BROOKINGS COUNTY under the same terms and options as available to Sourcewell, a copy of such bid specifications and bid having been filed at the Brookings County Finance Office; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to SDCL 5-18A-22, BROOKINGS COUNTY is authorized to purchase supplies or services from any active contract that has been awarded by any governmental entity by competitive sealed bids or competitive sealed proposals or from any contract that was competitively solicited and awarded within the previous twelve months;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Brookings County is hereby authorized and directed to contract for the removal and replacement of two chillers at the courthouse based upon the bid price, or less, as established through the competitive bidding process of Sourcewell.





## **DESCRIPTION OF WORK**

### **General Statement of Duties**

The fundamental reason this classification exists is to operate safely and efficiently specialized medium to heavy equipment (work with heavy equipment less than 80% of the time). The work requires considerable skill in manipulating medium to heavy equipment and constant attention to safety of operation in order to prevent accidents. Assignments are outlined in detail by supervisors. Standard procedures are followed and work is inspected periodically for safety and economy in operation. The Road Foreman will work as a lead to the Equipment Operator. General supervision is received from the Highway Superintendent and/or Lead foreman and work is reviewed through the proper functioning and performance of equipment.

**Examples of Duties:** (Any one position may not include all of the duties listed, nor do the listed examples include all duties which may be found in positions of this grade.)

- Operate and maintain medium to heavy duty capacity dump trucks, tractors, trailers, rollers, loaders, packers, power booms, recyclers, and trucks with specialized equipment to include sand spreader, hot oil distributor used in hauling materials and equipment to perform highway repair work.
- Operate truck mounted snowplows and other snow removal equipment
- Operate equipment of small to medium capacity such as loader, backhoe in performing highway repair and patchwork
- Operate other self-propelled equipment of similar size and complexity
- Operate heavy equipment on a limited basis in the performance of County functions
- Perform service and minor repairs to equipment to include maintenance, tire repair, etc

- Perform work in a manner consistent with safe practices.
- Wear personal protective equipment when required.
- Develop and maintain positive, professional relationships with the general public and other employees.





The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) received your request to remove the fields listed in Table 1 from your approved phosphorus-based NMP and add the fields listed in Table 2 your approved phosphorus-based NMP. Your existing phosphorus-based NMP is part of your application for coverage under the *2003 General Water Pollution Control Permit for Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations* (general permit). Your animal feeding operation was originally approved on November 14, 1996, and permitted on August 7, 1997, (**general permit # SDG-0100098**). The permit was transferred to Norfeld HBI on July 28, 2004.

We are also approving the proposed field addition and are including *Fields 5 and 6* in your approved phosphorus-based NMP. With the removal of *Fields 5 (old), 14, 15, 19, and 22*, and the addition of *Fields 5 and 6*, you still have adequate land available in your NMP to meet the permit requirements. **Please put one copy of the approved field information in Appendix D of your copy of the permit.** You are required to comply with the terms and conditions of your permit.

We have received your permit application for state permit coverage under the 2017 *General Water Pollution Control Permit for Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations* (2017 general permit) and your application is currently under review. Until permit coverage is issued under the 2017 general permit, you may continue to use your currently approved NMP for the land application of manure and wastewater from your operation in compliance with your coverage under the 2003 general permit. **If you would like the new fields to be included in the permit application for the 2017 general permit, an amended NMP which includes the necessary field information and updated spreadsheets will need to be submitted to the department for review and approval.**

You are also responsible for contacting the local planning and zoning office in the county where manure application will take place to determine if there are any local ordinances or requirements with which you need to comply.

All of the new fields will require soil tests from zero to two feet prior to manure application.

To add fields to your approved phosphorus-based NMP, you must submit the required information for each additional field to the department for our review and approval. The fields identified as being located over a shallow aquifer are shaded in the following tables and have additional soil testing requirements. For these fields, soil tests are required from 0 to 2 feet and 2 to 4 feet prior to manure application. Please refer to section 1.4.4.4., beginning on page 29 of the general permit for the annual nutrient management requirements.

For fields that require additional soil testing from 2 to 4 feet, you have the option to either conduct the initial 0 to 2-foot and the 2 to 4-foot soil test prior to land application of manure or the alternative option to conduct the initial 0 to 2-foot soil test prior to manure application and a second 0 to 2-foot soil test within four weeks after harvesting the crop. The Department of Environment and Natural Resources approved your permit application on July 23, 2020 for state permit coverage under the 2017 *General Water Pollution Control Permit for Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations* (general permit).

As you are aware, the department issues a Certificate of Compliance for manure management systems that have had plans and specifications approved and are constructed as designed. Your current Certificate of Compliance was issued on September 22, 2003 for a maximum of 2,000-head of finisher swine and no acres of drainage area. A copy of your current Certificate of Compliance is enclosed. This certificate shall remain in place until such time you change or expand your operation. Should you decide to change or expand your operation, you need to obtain approval of plans and specifications for any alterations or modifications to your manure management system prior to construction. Failure to do so will invalidate this certificate.

You have completed the requirements to obtain state permit coverage under the 2017 general permit (**permit number SDG-100183**). So, I am granting coverage for your existing manure management system under this permit and a copy of your permit is enclosed. Please refer to this permit number in any future permit correspondence. You are required to operate in compliance with the terms and conditions of this permit.

Your permit and a copy of your current Certificate of Compliance are in the Producer Handbook I am sending you. The Producer Handbook was developed to assist you in meeting the requirements of the General Permit. Using this book will help you manage the documents and paperwork that you will need to complete and retain while operating your animal feeding operation. The book contains forms that you can use to comply with the permit's requirements and is organized to give you a place to put other required information like soil and manure testing lab report forms. You are required to keep all records for a minimum of five years. It is not mandatory

The Department of Environment and Natural Resources received three copies of your application for state permit coverage of your existing permitted finisher swine operation under the 2017 *General Water Pollution Control Permit for Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations* (general permit), **permit application number SDG-100183**. The existing manure management system is currently permitted under the 2003 general permit and is located in the Northeast ¼ of the Southeast ¼ of Section 21, Township 112 North, Range 51 West in Brookings County, South Dakota. There are no changes to the existing manure management system proposed with the 2017 permit application.

On May 7, 2003, the department approved the original plans and specifications for your manure management system for a maximum of 4,000-head of finisher swine to be constructed in two phases. Phase #1 was constructed and permitted. Phase #2 was not constructed.

The permitted Phase 1 portion of your manure management system is for a housed lot feeding a maximum of 2,000-head of finisher swine weighing 55 pounds or more and consists of two deep pit barns with no acres of drainage area. The deep pit barns meet the requirements of the general permit and are designed for at least 270 days of liquid storage capacity.

On May 16, 2016, the department approved plans and specifications for the replacement of the Phase 2 portion of your previously approved manure management system with a single deep pit barn which would house a maximum of 2,400-head of finisher swine weighing 55 pounds or more with no acres of drainage area. The proposed deep pit barn meets the requirements of the general permit and is designed for at least 270 days of liquid storage capacity. With the proposed expansion, your operation will consist of three deep pit barns housing a maximum of 4,400-head of finisher swine once the Phase 2 finisher barn is completed and permitted.

**State Permit Application**

Your permit application includes a new Certification of Applicant Form, a new Notice of Intent Form, a new Operation and Maintenance guideline, and an updated nutrient management plan (NMP).

We have reviewed and hereby conditionally approve your 2017 permit application. We are also extending the approval of your Phase 2 finisher barn which has not yet been constructed. The Phase 2 finisher barn is the only remaining item from your approved manure management system that has not been constructed. **You will have three years to complete construction of this barn and submit as-built plans with a Notice of Completion. If construction is not completed within the three year timeframe this extended approval will expire.** Requirements you must implement are listed on the attached pages.

Upon completion of construction of the Phase 2 finisher barn, the enclosed Notice of Completion must be returned to the department. **You cannot populate the Phase 2 finisher barn or use the deep pit beneath this barn until an amended Certificate of Compliance and coverage under the 2017 state general permit are issued to include this barn. Once the Notice of Completion has been received and a satisfactory construction inspection has been conducted, the department will issue an amended Certificate of Compliance and coverage under the 2017 state general permit for this barn.**

One copy of the submitted permit application is being retained for our files. If you plan to increase your maximum number of animals or make any modifications to your manure management system, you must obtain department approval prior to increasing your animal numbers or beginning any new construction. If you plan to make any modifications to your nutrient management plan that include a change in manure application method, the addition of land application fields, or a change in crop rotation, you must obtain department approval prior to making the change.

Continued compliance is dependent upon you performing proper operation and maintenance activities. You will be liable for any noncompliance with applicable South Dakota environmental laws or regulations.

Our review covers works of sanitary significance and does not cover items such as quality of material, structural soundness, or electrical and mechanical design features. Approval of the plans and specifications does not in any way release the applicant from the responsibility that the project will be an operable facility when construction is completed.

## REQUIREMENTS

The following requirements must be implemented. Failure to implement these requirements will invalidate this approval.

### **State General Permit**

You will be required to operate your feeding operation and manure management system in accordance with the requirements in the general permit.

#### **1. Environmental Training**

Debra attended the environmental training session on December 1, 2019, and a copy of her training certificate was included with your permit application

#### **2. Ground Water Monitoring**

Based on the system design, soil boring logs, and other published reports and information, this system does not appear to overlie a shallow aquifer and should not impact ground water. Therefore, a Ground Water Discharge Permit and groundwater monitoring were not required. Should the design or operation of the facility change appreciably, new hydrogeological information become available, or any contamination problems be reported, the department reserves the right to reassess the need for possible remediation, monitoring of ground water, or a Ground Water Discharge Permit. For additional information concerning ground water monitoring, please contact Troy Roth, at (605) 773-3351.

#### **3. Notice of Intent Form (NOI)**

Your submitted Notice of Intent (NOI) form identifies a maximum of 4,400-head of swine weighing 55 pounds or more. The maximum number of swine to be housed at your operation includes the finisher swine to be housed in your proposed Phase 2 finisher barn that has not yet been constructed. **If for any reason you are unable to complete construction of the Phase 2 finisher barn by July 23, 2023, you will need to submit an updated NOI that identifies 2,000-head of swine and your nutrient management plan will need to be updated to be consistent with your NOI.**

#### **4. Composting of Animal Mortalities**

Section 1.4.3.3.y on page 23 of the general permit indicates animal mortalities shall be handled to prevent the discharge of manure and process wastewater to surface waters of the state. Proper disposal of animal mortalities, including composting, is regulated by the South Dakota Animal Industry Board. The Animal Industry Board's animal mortality disposal protocols and regulations must be followed for the disposal of animal mortalities from your facility. For information on their requirements, please contact the Animal Industry Board at (605) 773-3321. If you plan to compost animal mortalities at your operation using manure or process wastewater in the composting process, approval of plans and specifications and coverage under the general permit for the composting structure are required.

#### **5. Notification**

Other Government - You are responsible for contacting your local planning and zoning office to determine if there are any local ordinances or requirements with which you need to comply.

## REQUIREMENTS CONTINUED

### 6. Initial Nutrient Management Plan (NMP)

Your submitted NMP indicates that manure and wastewater will be applied in the spring, summer, and fall, and that the methods of manure application will include injection and sprinkling with and without incorporation. If solid manure or process wastewater is applied to fields other than cropped fields, grass, alfalfa, pasture land, or no-till cropland, liquid manure and process wastewater must be incorporated within 24 hours and solid or semi-solid manure must be incorporated within 5 days. Additional requirements pertaining to your NMP are listed on the following pages.

#### A. Endangered Species Action Plan

An Endangered Species Action Plan was included with your NMP and the plan includes best management practices to follow when manure or process wastewater are land applied to fields that are within  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile of a stream where Topeka shiners have been observed or have potentially occupied according to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. Based on your submitted NMP, a portion of the field listed on line 3 which is identified as "*The 40*" is within  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile of a stream where Topeka shiners have been observed or have potentially occupied. You need to review your Endangered Species Action Plan prior to land applying to this field.

#### B. Annual Soil Testing

Annual soil samples from 0 to 2 feet are required on all manure land application fields prior to manure application. The fields identified as being located over a shallow aquifer are shaded in Table 1 and have additional soil testing requirements. For these fields, soil tests are required from 0 to 2 feet and 2 to 4 feet prior to manure application.

For fields that require additional soil testing from 2 to 4 feet, you have the option to either conduct the initial 0 to 2-foot and the 2 to 4-foot soil test prior to land application or the alternative option to conduct the initial 0 to 2-foot soil test prior to land application and a second 0 to 2-foot soil test within four weeks of harvesting the crop. Please refer to section 1.4.4.3., beginning on page 35, of the 2017 general permit, for the annual nutrient management requirements. **You must notify the department in writing if you plan to use the alternative post-harvest soil sampling option under the 2017 general permit instead of the 2 to 4-foot soil sampling requirement.**

**If you have not elected to conduct the alternative post-harvest soil sampling and the department determines you are not conducting the required 2 to 4-foot soil sampling prior to manure application, you will be required to conduct the alternative post-harvest soil sampling on all fields requiring the additional 2 to 4-foot soil sampling and no longer have the option of taking the additional 2 to 4-foot soil samples prior to land application.**

#### C. Approved Land Application Fields

The fields listed in Table 1 below are approved under the 2017 general permit for the land application of manure or process wastewater. **Before manure or wastewater can be applied to these fields, you must obtain a current soil test and use the table on page 34 of the 2017 general permit to determine whether the field fits into a nitrogen need,**

**one-year phosphorus crop removal, five-year phosphorus crop removal, or no application category based on the current phosphorus level of the field and the predicted annual erosion.** Please refer to the table on page 34 and the annual nutrient management requirements beginning on page 35 of the 2017 general permit prior to the land application of manure to determine the proper procedure for calculating the appropriate application rate for each specific field.

Please note in your initial NMP the estimated time it will take to build your listed fields up to 50 ppm (Olsen test) or 75 ppm (Bray-1 test) of phosphorus. You may need additional land in order to apply to your fields based on phosphorus removal at that time.

**D. Land Application to Saturated, Snow-Covered, or Frozen Soil**

Your submitted NMP did not include a winter application field. Item A.2.c. of your O&M guideline indicates that you do not plan for application to saturated, snow-covered, or frozen ground and accept that doing so will be a violation of the general permit even in the event of an emergency.

Incorporation to non-vegetated crop ground is required for winter application. If incorporation is not possible, winter application may only be to cropped fields, grass, alfalfa, pasture land, or no-till cropland. The general permit requires manure or process wastewater applied to non-vegetated cropland to be incorporated; liquid manure and process wastewater must be incorporated within 24 hours and solid or semi-solid manure must be incorporated within 5 days.

If you propose to add winter application fields to your NMP or change your crop rotation to allow for winter application in the future, please review items H and J below for additional information before applying to those fields.

**E. Modification to Crop Rotation**

Your initial NMP identifies a specific crop rotation for each field and includes a list of alternative crops that may be substituted into the rotation. If for any reason an alternative crop that is not included in the list of alternative crops is planned to be grown, that change

would be considered a major modification and would require a revised alternative crop list to be submitted to the department for review and approval.

### F. Certified Soil and Manure Testing Laboratories

As part of your annual nutrient management planning requirements, soil and manure tests must be analyzed by certified soil testing and manure testing labs. The laboratory analyzing the soil samples must be accredited by the **North American Proficiency Testing Programs' Proficiency Assessment Program** and the labs that are currently accredited are listed on the following website: <http://www.naptprogram.org/pap>. The laboratory analyzing the manure or process wastewater must be certified by the **Manure Testing Laboratory Certification Program** and the manure testing labs that are currently certified are listed on the following website: <http://www2.mda.state.mn.us/webapp/lis/manurelabs.jsp>.

If you or your crop consultant sends your soil or manure samples to a lab that is not listed on either of these websites, you and/or crop consultant may want to tell them that you need to use a certified lab so they can become certified.

### G. Field Addition Requirements

To add fields to your approved NMP, you must submit the required information for each additional field to the department for our review and approval. Information on adding fields to your approved NMP may be obtained from your local Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) office. You may also contact us for assistance at (605) 773-3351, or visit our website at <http://denr.sd.gov/des/fp/FieldAdditions.aspx> for instructions on adding fields to your NMP. **You cannot apply manure to any fields not included in your approved NMP.**

### H. Mobile Land Application Systems

If a mobile land application system using temporary piping will be used for the land application of liquid manure or process wastewater, the equipment must be equipped with an on-board radio controller and flow meter that can be overseen by the applicator. See Section 1.4.4.1.m. on page 30 of the 2017 general permit for more information on this requirement.

## 7. Setback Distance and Water Wells

The manure management system and the application sites must be located at least 100 feet from a private well owned by you if the top of the aquifer is 100 feet or more below the land surface, 150 feet from a private well owned by you if the top of the aquifer is less than 100 feet below the land surface, 250 feet from a private well not owned by you and 1,000 feet from any public supply well. These areas cannot be included in the land application areas.

## 8. Other Permit(s) That Will or May Be Required

Storm Water Permit - If the construction associated with your Phase 2 finisher barn will disturb more than one acre in total land area, **you must obtain a general storm water construction permit prior to beginning construction.** This permit must be obtained before you can start

constructing your proposed manure management system. Information concerning this permit can be obtained by calling the Surface Water Quality Program at 1-800-737-8676. **A copy of this plan must be kept on-site during construction for review by DENR inspectors.**

Emergency Power Generator - The department has observed that emergency power generators have been installed at similar sized operations. If an emergency power generator will be installed at your operation it may require that you obtain an air quality permit. Please contact Kristen Hendricks with the department's Air Quality Program at (605) 773-3151, to determine whether an air quality permit is required. If an air quality permit is required, you must have that permit prior to using the generator.

Permit to Occupy Right of Way - If manure application will involve placing hoses or other equipment in a state highway right of way (for example, in a road ditch or through a culvert), you must first obtain a Permit to Occupy Right of Way. Application for this permit may be made through the local South Dakota Department of Transportation area office. Contact your local SD DOT area office for more information on this permit. In addition, please contact your county highway superintendent to determine if your county has similar requirements.
