RE: Staff Report Law Changes July 1, 2016

**HB 1005:**

Title fees go from \$5.00 to \$10.00 and the county keeps \$5.00  
Lien Notation increases from \$5.00 to \$10.00 County keeps \$10.00  
Boat admin fee increase from \$1.00 to \$3.00 County keeps the \$3.00  
Refund admin fee goes from \$5.00 to \$10.00 County keeps \$10.00  
Sheriff Service charge increased

**HB 1083:**

ATV will be charged 4% excise tax and that will be collected at Finance Office (prior to July 1, 2016 they were charged SD sales & use tax and it was collected by dealer or DOR)

**HB 1095:**

Seller's permits on private sales are now valid for 45 days so it is the same time frame as from dealers

**HB 1098:**

Revises exemption amount from \$2200. To \$2500. On any motor vehicle that is eleven or more model years old.

**HB 1179:**

Revises exemption amount on boats from \$2200. To \$2500. That are 11 or more years old.

**HB 1113:**

Allows for an exemption to transfer a motor vehicle to a non-profit as a gift and not be charged excise tax but vehicle has to be sold within 45 days.

**HB 1137:**

Revises the distribution fees on noncommercial gross weight vehicles

**HB 1164:**

Waive the requirement to display a front license plate on special interest vehicles requirements include \$25.00 fee in addition to yearly plate fee. Odometer reading must be less than 6000 miles. Odometer reading has to be provided on application and also each year for renewal. The registration card will print odometer reading and it will also state Special Interest Plate

**SB66:**

Allows the parent or legal guardian of a child with a substantial physical disability to apply for special handicapped plates the applicant does not have to have their name on the title.

**SB2:**

Revised the distribution of revenue from the alcoholic beverage fund. Counties will now receive 25% of that money
