

Bi-Annual Commission Report Summary January 2019 – June 2019

WIC: We continue to provide supplemental nutritional foods, nutrition education, support, and referrals to clients, to local Brookings county resources. We continue to market to various organizations in the Community. The WIC program includes a variety of educational topics not limited to nutrition. These topics include items such as development, literacy, and oral health. The United Way in Brookings continues to support oral health by bringing in the Mobile Dental Unit four times per year. Our office continues to refer clients to this resource, who do not have a local dental home.

Immunizations: Flu shots were offered through June. We continue our monthly focus on reaching out to families of infant, children, and adolescents that are not up to date on recommended immunizations. We continue to refer clientele to establish a primary care provider and attend Well Child visits routinely, as well as offering immunizations in office. We continue to offer multiple payment options. We are again working with the Brookings POD group to plan an upcoming flu shot event on October 15th, at SDSU. This event will focus on providing the flu vaccine to SDSU students.

School Services: School services were completed for the school year. We reviewed 2018-2019 school contracts with our contracted schools and submitted them to the SD Department of Health.

Baby Care/Prenatal Education: We continue to meet with all pregnant women monthly and provide prenatal education and breastfeeding education.

Infant Mortality: We continue to provide safe sleep education and options to clients, including pack and plays, smoking cessation, immunizations, safe sleep, and breast feeding.

Staffing: We continue to be fully staffed. We have assisted in training new staff from other counties within our Region.

Staff training/Continuing Education: All staff are up to date on training.

Community Involvement: Monthly Child Protection Service meeting, Monthly POD Planning (Points of Dispensing) meeting, Quarterly LEPC (Local Emergency Planning Committee), Monthly Brookings Mental Health Coalition Meeting, Local clinic support

and collaboration, Immunization support including biannual immunization meeting with local entities (clinic staff, school nurses), Participation support involving a variety of entities including Department of Human Services, Housing, and resource sharing involvement.

Upcoming Events: In July, staff traveled to Pierre for three days and attended the Office of Child and Family Services all staff conference.
