

# Youth in Action

July 13 & 15



## PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS

Brookings County Public Presentations contest will be held **July 13** at the Brookings County Outdoor Adventure Center. Pre-registration for the contest is due in FairEntry by **July 6**. No late submissions will be accepted.

**2020 Event Changes**—Participants will select a time-slot in FairEntry. Exhibitors present to the judges, receive their ribbons (purple, blue, red, white, or Cloverbud), take their picture and then leave premises with their entire party. Presentations can have a maximum of 10 spectators in attendance. We recommend this be limited to immediate family members. Presenters may remove their mask once they are behind the acrylic shields during their presentation.

State Public Presentation pre-registrations are due in FairEntry by 11:59 p.m. on **August 11**. Please see the 2020 State Fair Public Update for important updates regarding state-level participation.

## FASHION REVUE

Brookings County Fashion Revue will be held **July 15** at the Brookings County Outdoor Adventure Center. Pre-registration for the contest is due in FairEntry by **July 6**. No late submissions will be accepted.

**2020 Event Changes**—This year exhibitors **may only exhibit 1 outfit** for Fashion Revue. There will be no public style show at Achievement Days this year; however we will publicize a virtual slideshow of the participants. Participants will select a time-slot in FairEntry. Exhibitors will meet with the judges, take a picture for the virtual slide show, and then exit. The event is not open to spectators. Attendance is limited to just the exhibitors and 1 guardian/driver.

State Fashion Revue pre-registrations are due in FairEntry by 11:59 p.m. on **August 11**. Please see the 2020 State Fair Public Update for important updates regarding state-level participation.

# Dog Show

**July 27**



The County Dog Show will be held **July 27** at the Brookings County Outdoor Adventure Center. Pre-registration for the county show is due by **July 16** to Kristie Thompson. No late submissions will be accepted. The [Dog Project ID Affidavit & Vaccination Verification form](#) must be signed by a vet by **July 24**.

**2020 Event Changes**— Show events (obedience, showmanship, and rally) will be set up in separate locations and run simultaneously. Participants will complete events in succession on a staggered schedule. Once the participant is finished they will be asked to wait in appropriately distanced locations set up in the parking lot . Participants will receive the judges feedback, their ribbons (purple, blue, red, white, or Cloverbud) and overall champion awards will be presented at the completion of the show. Attendance is limited to just the exhibitors and 1 guardian/driver.

# Horse Show

**July 28**



The County Horse Show will be held **July 28** at the Swiftel Center Holding Barn. Pre-registration for the county show is due in FairEntry by **July 16**. No late submissions will be accepted. Health papers are required by the day of the show. The outdoor riding area will be utilized for warm-ups.

**2020 Event Changes**—This year exhibitors may only participate in 1 class per event division (showmanship, equitation/performance, and timed events). The Horse Show will begin with showmanship, then equitation/performance will follow, with timed events to finish. Attendance at the ring/holding barn at a time is limited to one exhibitor and their parent/guardian. Upon completion of their event, they will leave the building with everyone in their party. Ribbons and awards will be presented after the events.

State Horse Show pre-registrations are due in FairEntry by 11:59 p.m. on **August 11**. The State Horse show will be held in Huron on **August 29-30**. Please see the 2020 State Dog Show Public Update for important updates regarding state-level participation.

# Display Exhibits

**August 3, 9:00am – 2:00pm**



Display Exhibit Judging will take place on **August 3** in the Swiftel Center Arena. Pre-registration for display exhibits is due in FairEntry by **July 16**. No late submissions will be accepted.

## **2020 Event Changes—**

- ◆ Exhibitors may only enter **10 display exhibits** (maximum of two per lot).
  - ◆ All photography exhibits will be judged virtually and will count toward the 10 exhibits.
- ◆ Interview judging for all project areas (excluding photography) will be done in scheduled time slots on August 3.
- ◆ There will be no drop-off judging option for this year's exhibits and no public project display.
- ◆ Participants will be asked to upload a picture of each entry into Fair Entry to allow for a virtual display to be created by the office staff.

## **Virtual Entries**

If participants are uncomfortable with face-to-face judging, they will have the option of choosing a virtual entry on FairEntry and submitting a YouTube video (please see Youtube Guidance page for instructions) for all non-photography entries to be judged virtually. In the video, the 4-H member will list their name, age division, years in project area, and answer the below questions:

1. What steps did you take in making this exhibit?
2. What knowledge and/or skills have you learned in this project area this year?
3. What is the most important thing the judge needs to know about your exhibit — challenges, special techniques, etc.?
  - ◆ Include any additional information that is required for this exhibit as described in the State Fair book (i.e. horticulture varieties, child development ages, etc.).

## **Important Safety Requirements**

Due to COVID-19 all 2020 county shows and events will include limitations in order to provide the safest environment possible for exhibitors, families, and staff.

- ◆ All 4-H events held in August are limited to a maximum group size of 50.
- ◆ Only essential personnel will be allowed at display exhibit judging. This includes 4-H member, their driver, office staff, and judges.
- ◆ Anyone who feels sick or has any symptoms of illness should NOT attend in-person events.
- ◆ EVERYONE in attendance MUST WEAR A MASK!

# Livestock Shows

**August 3-6**



## **2020 Event Changes—**

Livestock shows will be held at the Swiftel Center **August 3-6**. All livestock exhibitors are **limited to 5 large animal** (beef, dairy, swine, sheep, goats) **and 5 small animal** (poultry, rabbit, companion animal) exhibits. For all of the species and showmanship contests, ribbon placings (purple, blue, red, white, Cloverbud) will be awarded.

Complete shows are set to take place to include class winners and Grand and Reserve Champions for species and showmanship. For these to be awarded there must be 100% in-person participation or a plan to include exhibitors who choose Level A participation.

\*In the case that an in-person swine show is not allowed, grand & reserve champion selections will need to be re-evaluated.

All exhibitors wanting to participate in the show and showmanship must be registered in FairEntry by **July 16th**, prior to Achievement Days.

## **Check-In will run as followed:**

Trailers will arrive through the South East parking lot of the Swiftel center. When exhibitors and drivers exit the vehicle, masks need to be worn. **(Masks will not be provided. No mask. No entry)**. Exhibitors will be assigned a numbered trailer spot and must park between the cones in their designated space.

Once the exhibitor and their trailer are parked this will be considered their 'home base'. Families should be conscious of social distancing standards.

## **Health Papers:**

A separate health paper will need to be provided for each species exhibited. Once they are handed in at check-in, they **will not** be returned. Example: You bring 2 swine exhibits and 3 beef, you must have the 2 swine and 3 beef on **separate** papers or a copy of the health paper for each day.

## **Show Set Up:**

All shows will take place in the Holding Barn and a ring will be set up to accommodate for social distancing standards provided by SDSU Extension and South Dakota 4-H.

The exhibitor and their animal will enter the ring through the East door and exit through the Southwest door. Penning will be set up at the opposite end of the show ring for class winners until champion drive to reduce bottlenecking and over crowding.

# Small Animal Shows



**August 3-4**

**2020 Event Changes**—All vehicles will enter through the Southeast entrance and be directed to a numbered parking spot. This is to be exhibitors ‘home base’ for the duration of the show. Exhibitors are required to bring their animals in to the show ring in proper carrying cages. Rabbit and companion animal exhibitors are responsible for bringing their own carpet square or mat for the show.

All exhibitors that wish to participate in showmanship must pre-register by **July 16**, prior to Achievement Days through FairEntry. There will be no exceptions on show day.

## Rabbit & Poultry:

Rabbit exhibits will be assigned an individual ‘home base’ set up around the ring in the Holding Barn, appropriately distanced. The judge will travel to each station to award ribbons (purple, blue, red, white, Cloverbud) and continue to the next station.

Showmanship will occur simultaneously with the animal judging. The showmanship judge will begin in the opposite corner of the ring so after the exhibitor has met with both judges, they can be released from the ring.

## Companion Animal:

Companion animals will be assigned a station in the Arena of the Swiftel Center. Each exhibitor will take turns presenting their animal at the judge’s table.

# Large Animal Shows

**August 4-6**



**2020 Event Changes**—All large animal shows will be held in a trailer show format. Families will arrive at their species check-in time and will leave after the conclusion of the show. No overnight stalling will be provided. Limited wash rack facilities will be available on the far west end of the Holding Barn. It is highly recommended your animals come washed to limit bottle necking for safety reason. There will be no wash rack space available in the holding barn.

Market classes will be shown by weight but there will be no scale provided. Animals weights will be declared prior to or at check-in. Show orders will be arranged to make for the least number of classes. This means breeding show could be organized by breed and birthday or just birthdate. Market classes may not be broken into separate breed categories.

Showmanship for large animals will be at the beginning of each show. Exhibitors must be pre-registered for showmanship by **July 16** through FairEntry. There will be no exceptions on show day.

# Virtual Small Animal Exhibits

**August 3-6**



## Virtual Achievement Days Submissions:

This is very similar to how you would make your entry in past years in FairEntry, except at the end you upload your project instead of bringing it to the show. We highly recommend you have your project videos completed BEFORE beginning the submission process. **All deadlines for virtual exhibit submissions are July 16 in FairEntry (excluding Youth in Action events).**

## Small Animals:

Exhibitors will upload a photo collage of multiple angles of the animal depending on species to FairEntry. (For a tutorial on how to create a collage see an example from a rabbit show <https://www.facebook.com/sally.larson/videos/10220198885895869/> )

**Pictures should NOT contain:** the exhibitor's name/farm/rabbitry/etc., the exhibitor's hands (except for belly and open wing photos), a background that blends in with the animal or contains distractions.

## Rabbits:

Exhibitors will upload a photo collage containing pictures of:

1. Left Side
2. Right Side
3. Front Facing
4. Back (top down)
5. Belly
6. Text with the animal's ID number, breed, color/markings (if applicable) sex, and age class

## Poultry:

Exhibitors will upload a photo collage containing pictures of:

1. Side Profile
2. Front Facing
3. Rear Facing
4. 1 Open Wing (to display feathers)
5. 1 Head profile (must include the comb, eye, and beak)
6. Text with the animal's leg band number, breed, color/markings (if applicable) sex, and age class

## Companion Animal:

Exhibitors will submit a showmanship video (see instructions below) based on either the cat or companion animal showmanship scoresheets available on <https://extension.sdstate.edu/state-fair>

## Showmanship:

If you would like to participate in showmanship virtually, please submit a separate video link in FairEntry (see YouTube Guidance page for instructions). Showmanship videos should include an introduction (see **Exhibit Introduction Script** on the next page) be based off of the species' scoresheet available on <https://extension.sdstate.edu/state-fair>

# Virtual Large Animal Exhibits

**August 3-6**



## Virtual Achievement Days Submissions:

This is very similar to how you would make your entry in past years in FairEntry, except at the end you upload your project instead of bringing it to the show. We highly recommend you have your project videos completed BEFORE beginning the submission process. **All deadlines for virtual exhibit submissions are July 16 in FairEntry (excluding Youth in Action events).**

## Large Animal:

Video entries will be no longer than 2 minutes. The first 30 seconds will be an introduction of the exhibitor and their animal (see introduction speech below) followed by video showing all views of the animal.

Combine the exhibitors introduction and animal video and upload to YouTube (see YouTube Guidance page for instructions), then provide the link in your FairEntry registration.

## Showmanship:



## Virtual Video Entries

### Uploading from a Computer

1. If you do not currently have a YouTube account Go to <https://www.youtube.com/> Click on: “Sign-in” Click on “Create Account” and follow prompts to create account.
2. Once an account has been created, log into your YouTube account using your log-in credentials Click on the Home Screen Tool Bar at the top right click on the video camera picture with the plus sign. Click on “Upload Video”>Select Files to Upload>Upload File>
3. Title/naming upload with Age Division\_ Last Name, First Name>>>Description \_\_\_\_\_>click on Yes, it’s made for kids >>>
  - a. Description should describe whatever the video is. Include project, division, class, etc.
4. Click Next
5. Click Next
6. \*Privacy>click on “**Unlisted**” click on “Save”
7. To Share Link: Click on “E-mail” (may have to arrow a few options to the right). Click on “Send to personal e-mail” to double check the video link.
8. Copy and paste the link into FairEntry or forward the e-mail to who you want to have view the video.

### Uploading to a Phone or Tablet using the YouTube App

1. If you do not currently have a YouTube account Go to <https://www.youtube.com/> Click on: “Sign-in” Click on “Create Account” and follow prompts to create account.
2. Once an account has been created, log into your YouTube account using your log-in credentials. Click on the video camera icon at the top of your screen. Below “Record,” or “Go Live,” it will show videos on your device.
3. Find the video you want to upload. click on the video, then click “Add Details.” This will show at the top of the screen **DO NOT CLICK UPLOAD YET!**
4. Title/naming upload with Age Division\_ Last Name, First Name>>>Description \_\_\_\_\_>click on Yes, it’s made for kids >>>
5. \*Privacy Settings: click on “**Unlisted**” Click on “UPLOAD” at top right of screen.
6. Once video has uploaded, to the right of the video, click on the 3 vertical dots. Click on “Share” Select Gmail or whatever e-mail you have on your device. E-mail to your personal e-mail to double check the link.
7. Copy and paste the link into FairEntry or forward the e-mail to who you want to have view the video.

**\*Note – Videos that are uploaded in the Unlisted setting may only be viewed by those that have access to the link. There is no fee to use YouTube.**
